

From the Pastor's Desk

Today we celebrate the **30th Sunday of Ordinary Time**. In the gospel story today Jesus heals the blind man Bartimaeus. The key to his healing was faith. May our own faith guide us to see the "blind spots" in our own vision, so that we might see Christ more clearly.

This weekend is **Stewardship Sunday**. We ask you to return your completed Stewardship forms to the designated location in the Gathering Space, or mail them back to the Parish Office. Thank you for discerning your gift of stewardship to the Lord that you offer in love of Jesus and in support of the mission of Blessed Sacrament Parish.

This upcoming Friday, November 1 is the **Solemnity of All Saints!** This is a Holy Day of Obligation requiring our Mass attendance. For our parish members' participation, we will offer two Masses for this Solemnity:

Friday, November 1 @ 5:30 p.m.

This weekend (October 26/27) our Parish Haiti Committee will present their **Annual Financial Report on monies given through our monthly Haiti Sister Parish 2nd Collection**. Haiti Committee Chairperson Joe Bordewick will have both a written and verbal report to give to all of us on how our monies are being spent for our Sister Parish of St. Antoine in Haiti. I thank our entire Haiti Committee for their continued good work in communicating with our Sister Parish and giving us all continued direction on how best to support our Sister Parish of St. Antoine.

In one week - **Saturday, November 2 at 9:00 a.m.** - we will celebrate our annual **Mass of Remembrance**. We invite parish members to attend who have lost a loved one during the past year. We ask the Lord to bring the fullness of eternal life to all who have gone before us marked with the sign of faith.

On **Saturday, November 16** our parish is hosting a **Day Trip to visit the Abbey of Our Lady of Ephesus in Gower, MO**. This abbey was founded by Sr. Wilhemina Lancaster, who died in 2019, and whose body was found incorrupt when it was exhumed in April 2023. During our day trip we will attend Mass with the Benedictine Sisters at 11:00 a.m., followed by lunch and short tour of the abbey grounds. **Cost of the trip is \$30.00 per person** (made payable to Blessed Sacrament) plus bringing along your own lunch. Please contact the Parish Office right away to sign up for the trip. We will need a minimum of 16 people in order to take 2 vans, otherwise our maximum will be 12 persons for one van. Deadline for registration is **Friday, November 8**.


