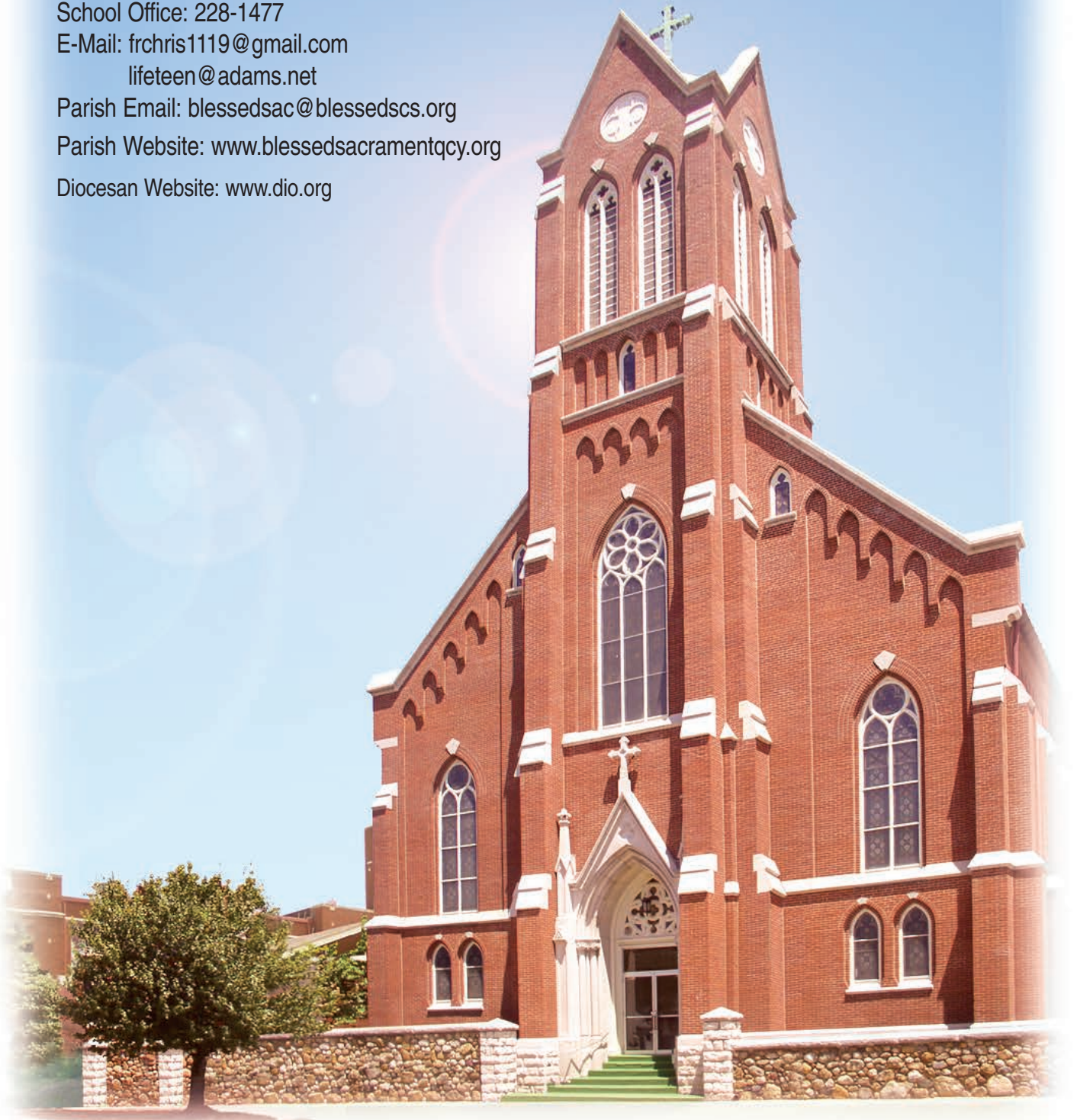

Did you know ??

Blessed Sacrament Parish has a thriving Cub Scout and Boy Scout Program?

The Cub Scout Program is open to kids that are in Kindergarten through Fifth grade. It is broken down into age groups as follows:



Lions – Kindergarten
Tigers – 1st Grade
Wolves – 2nd Grade
Bears – 3rd Grade
Webelos – 4th & 5th Grades



Once a Cub Scout reaches the middle of his second year of Webelos (usually February), he crosses over into the Boy Scout Troop. A young man can be a part of the Boy Scout Troop from crossover through the age of 18. Young men can join either program at any age between Kindergarten and the age of 18. There are no restrictions or prerequisites other than that.

The Cub Scout Group meets once a month as a “pack”. This is when all of the age groups gather together for a joint meeting. Additionally, they will camp together a few times a year. All other Cub Scout activities take place at the “den” level. These meetings are with Scouts of the same grade level. There is a summer camp program for Cub Scouts that lasts from 2-3 days depending upon the age of the Scout.

The Boy Scout Troop meets weekly. The purpose of Boy Scout meetings is to teach young people basic camping, ethical, first aid, and citizenship and leadership skills with the ultimate goal of each Scout at least attaining the rank of First Class. Once a Scout has achieved the First Class rank, he will have learned all of Scouting’s basic skills. The young man is then challenged to pursue the rank of Eagle Scout, the pinnacle of a Scout’s career. Only approximately 4% of all Boy Scouts achieve this goal.

The Troop camps almost monthly and the highlight of the annual program is a one week summer camp. Additionally, every few years the Troop will undertake a “high adventure” trip which might be backpacking in the mountains of New Mexico, canoeing the boundary waters of Canada or attending the National Boy Scout Jamboree in West Virginia. All of these experiences create memories that last a lifetime.

All young men are encouraged to at least attend a meeting or two to learn more about Scouting. Just contact a leader to set-up a visit which will likely lead to a lifetime full of fun and memories!
