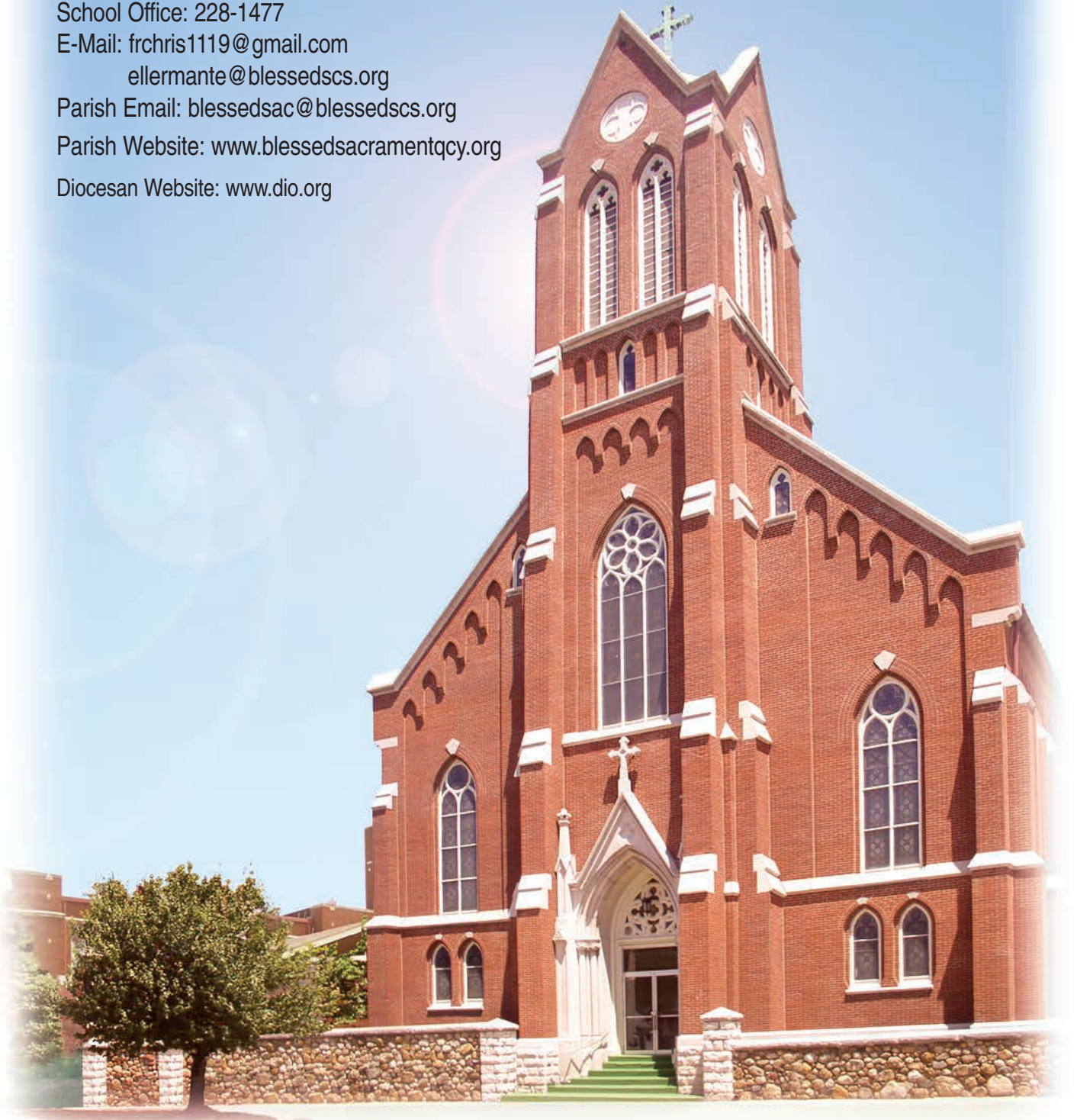

FATHER CHRIS'S COLUMN



Readings:

Isaiah 42:1-4, 6-7

Psalm 29:1-4, 9-10

Luke 3:15-16, 21-22

The Liturgy last week revealed the mystery of God's plan—that in Jesus all peoples, symbolized by the Magi, have been made “co-heirs” to the blessings promised Israel. This week, we're shown how we claim our inheritance.

Jesus doesn't submit to John's baptism as a sinner in need of purification. He humbles Himself to pass through Jordan's waters in order to lead a new “exodus”—opening up the promised land of heaven so that all peoples can hear the words pronounced over Jesus today, words once reserved only for Israel and its king: that each of us is a beloved son or daughter of God (see Genesis 22:2; Exodus 4:22; Psalm 2:7).

Jesus is the chosen servant Isaiah prophesies in today's First Reading, anointed with the Spirit to make things right and just on earth. God puts His Spirit upon Jesus to make Him “a covenant of the people,” the liberator of the captives, the light to the nations. Jesus, today's Second Reading tells us, is the One long expected in Israel, “anointed . . . with the Holy Spirit and power.”

The word messiah means “one anointed” with God's Spirit. King David was “the anointed of the God of Jacob” (see 2 Samuel 23:1-17; Psalm 18:51; 132:10, 17). The prophets taught Israel to await a royal offshoot of David, upon whom the Spirit would rest (see Isaiah 11:1-2; Daniel 9:25).

That's why the crowds are so anxious at the start of today's Gospel. But it isn't John they're looking for. God confirms with His own voice what the angel earlier told Mary: Jesus is the Son of the Most High, come to claim the throne of David forever (see Luke 1:32-33).

The beauty of FORMED is the wealth of books, videos, study materials, movies, children's resources, inspirational readings, etc., that can help us all grow in our faith. To use these materials, you just need to sign up. It is a gift of the parish to each of us. To sign up you just go to: blessedsacramentqcy.formed.org. and sign up. You then have free access to everything there. I hope everyone will sign up. We have 125 parishioners already signed up. Below, you will see how we will be using FORMED, in a parish-wide study.

Please join us as we do a Parish Study on PRESENCE, the Mystery of the Eucharist.

The Parish Study will be starting in a few weeks. There are 3 videos which we ask for you to view. The sessions are:

Session 1 God is with Us (35 minutes)	Week 1
Session 2 The Story of the Eucharist (41 minutes)	Week 2
Session 3 Bread for the Journey (35 minutes)	Week 3

Everyone will view the session on their own each week and at the end of the sessions you will have an opportunity to get together and discuss what you have seen and heard. There are study guides which can be downloaded free or you can purchase the study guides for \$6 if you wish. The study guides will need to be ordered by January 28, 2019. To order the study guides you just need to call the office (222-2759). The Parish Study is just one way that our parish can be focused or centered on a particular topic. The Eucharist, which is the source and summit of our faith, is a great one to start with. You will be hearing more about this opportunity in the next few weeks.
