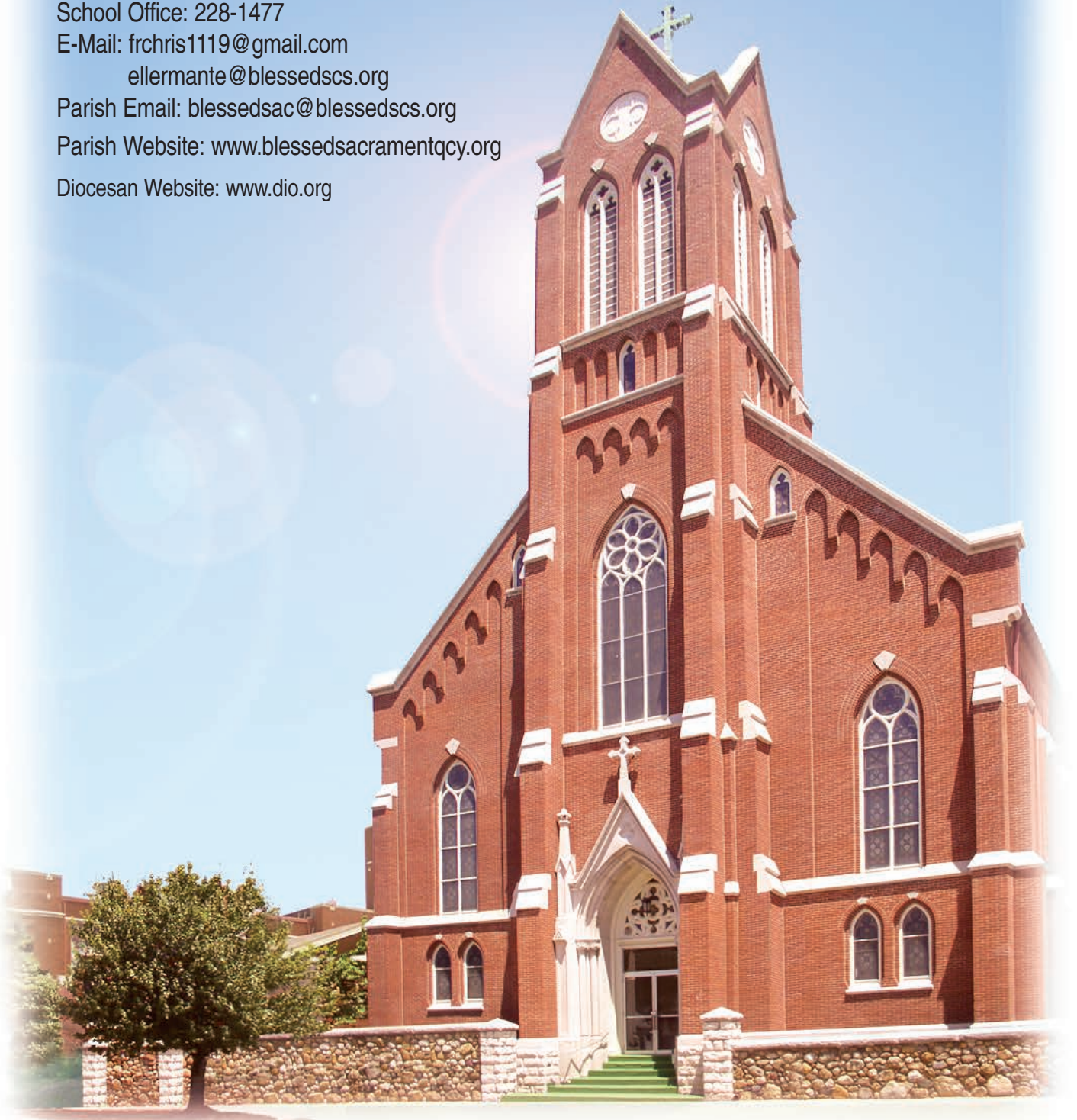

Christmas Eve

Christmas Eve is the evening or entire day before Christmas Day, the festival commemorating the birth of Jesus. Christmas Day is observed around the world, and Christmas Eve is widely observed as a full or partial holiday in anticipation of Christmas Day.

Christmas Truce:

During World War I in 1914 and 1915 there was an unofficial Christmas truce, particularly between British and German troops. The truce began on Christmas Eve, Dec. 24, 1914, when German troops began decorating the area around their trenches. They began by placing candles on trees, then continued the celebration by singing Christmas carols, most notably “Silent Night”. The British troops in the trenches across from them responded by singing English carols. The two sides shouted Christmas greetings to each other. Soon there were calls for visits across the “No Man’s Land” when small gifts were exchanged. The truce also allowed space during which recently killed soldiers could be brought back behind their lines by burial parties. Funerals took place as soldiers from both sides mourned the dead and paid their respects. At one funeral in “No Man’s Land”, soldiers from both sides gathered and read a passage from Psalm 23. The truce occurred in spite of opposition at higher levels of Military command.
