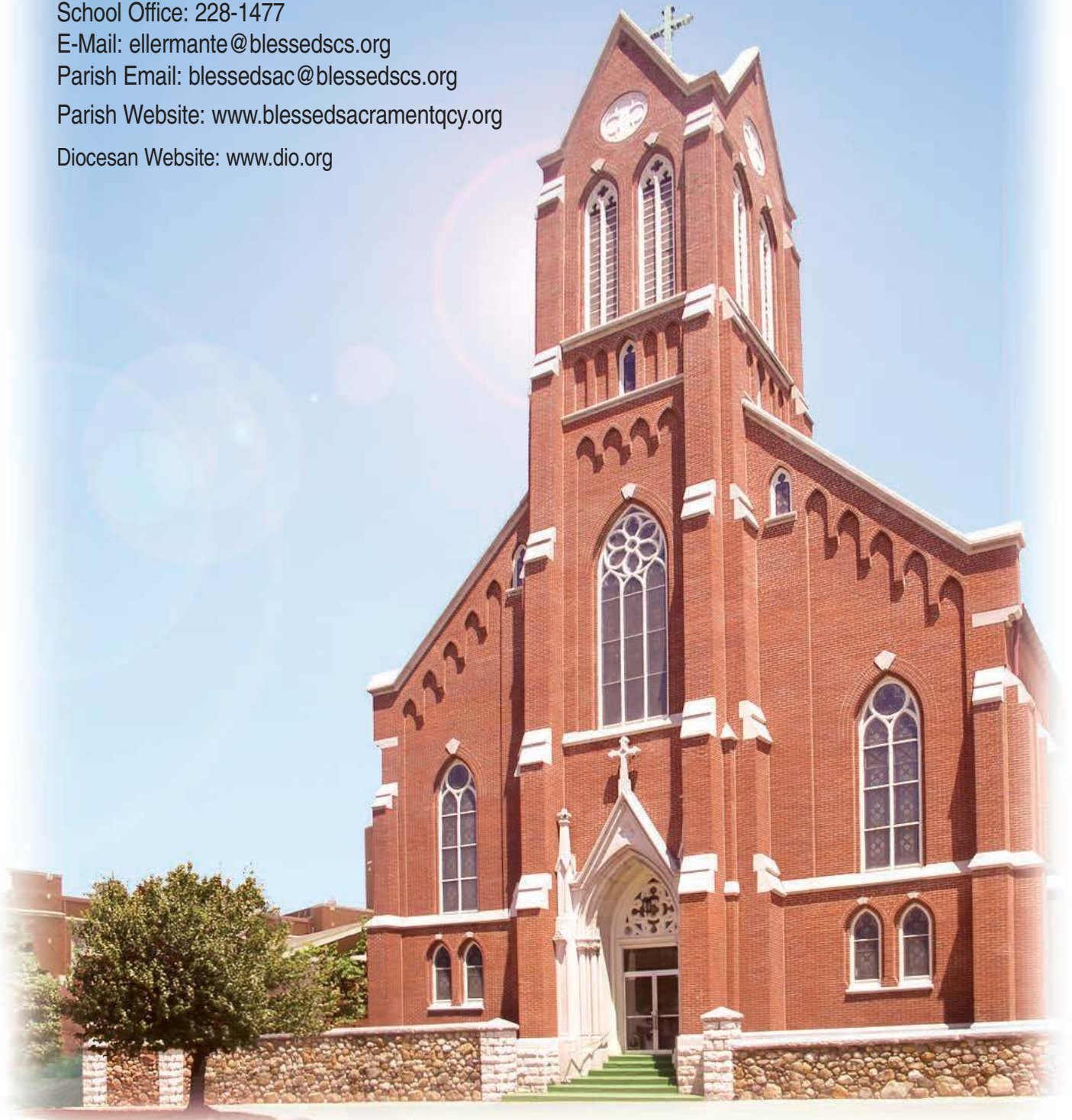

Dear Supporter,

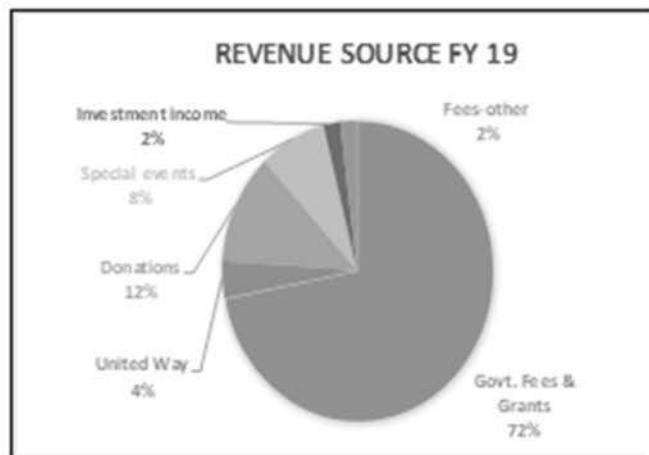

Blessed Sacrament School Partners with Quincy Public Schools for Food Distribution of Meals

In early April, Blessed Sacrament partnered with Quincy Public Schools to become a food distribution site to any family in Quincy for daily pick-up of a breakfast and lunch for all children under 18 years of age.

We are one of four distribution sites that operates from 10-noon each day. Each weekday morning a Quincy Public Schools truck delivers the pre-bagged meals to our refrigerators and QPS food service workers Peggy Rowsey (Blessed Sacrament parishioner) and Tina McClean distribute meals in a safe and socially distant manner. This food distribution process serves approximately 1,100 families a day in Quincy and up to 160 are picked up each day at Blessed Sacrament. This service will continue until August 6.

We are very proud to partner with QPS in this critically important service for the children and families in Quincy!

St. Kateri Tekakwitha And Our Lady of Mount Carmel

St. Kateri Tekakwitha – is celebrated on July 14

– She was born in the Mohawk village of Ossernenon, in the present-day New York State, in 1656. She was named Tekakwitha at birth. She was



the only one in her family to survive the smallpox epidemic when it struck, but left her face scarred. At the age of nineteen she converted to Catholicism. She was baptized, April 18, 1676 and remand Kateri, in honor of Catherine of Siena and informally known as “Lily of the Mohawks”. Known for her virtue of chastity and mortification of the flesh, as well as being shunned by some of her tribe for her religious conversion to Catholicism, ***she is the fourth Native American to be venerated in the Catholic Church and the first to be canonized.*** St. Kateri Tekakwitha is a Catholic saint who was an Algonquin-Mohawk laywoman. She died April 17, 1680 in Kahnawake, Canada and is buried at Mission Catholique St. Francis Xavier Catholic Mission, Kahnawake, Canada.

Our Lady of Mount Carmel is celebrated on July 16 –

Our Lady of Mount Carmel is the title given to the Blessed Virgin Mary in her role as patroness of the Carmelite Order. The first Carmelites were Christian hermits living on Mount Carmel in the Holy Land during the late 12th and early to mid-13th century.

Popular devotion to Our Lady of Mt. Carmel centered on the Scapular of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, also known as the Brown Scapular. Traditionally, Mary is said to have given the Scapular to an early Carmelite named St. Simon Stock. The feast was first celebrated in England in the later part of the 14th century. It's object was thanksgiving to Mary for the benefits she accorded to the order during the difficult first years.
