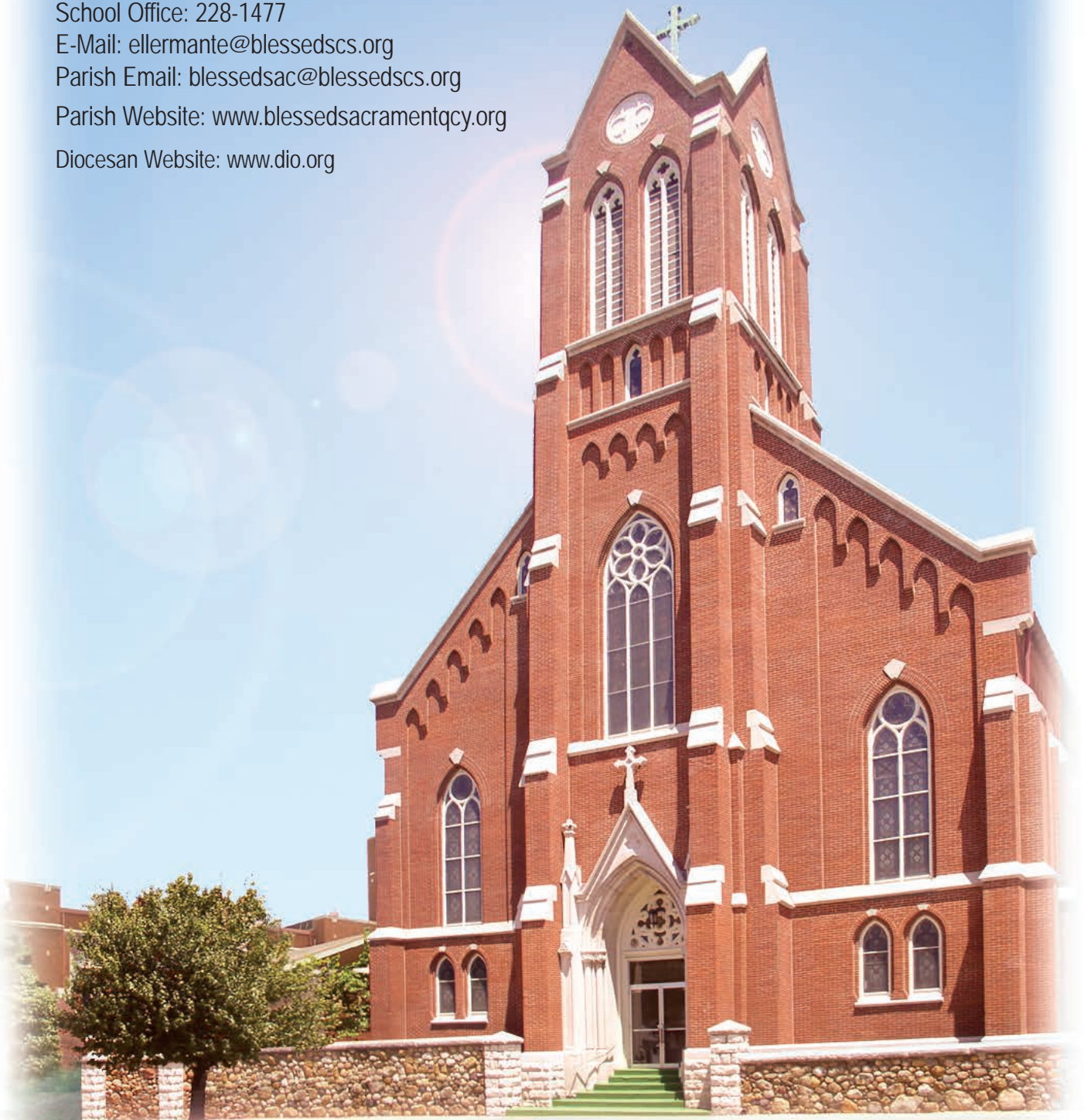

**FATHER TOM'S COLUMN**

**FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK**

Today the Church celebrates the **16<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time**. We hear today from Matthew's Gospel the **Parable of the Wheat and the Weeds**. A man sowed good wheat seeds, but at night an enemy sowed weeds among them. The sower's servants wish to pull out the weeds. However, the weeds and wheat appear so similar that there is a danger in attempting to pull out the weeds that some of the wheat might be uprooted as well. The sower asks that they all grow together until harvest, when the weeds will be collected and burned. Jesus uses this parable to describe the Kingdom of God here on earth. There is always good and evil living together among us, and often they are indistinguishable. At the same time, there is always conversion and reversion consistently in motion. Weeds are converting to wheat, and wheat is reverting to weeds. Jesus urges patience since we do not always discern well the value of every human heart. And the Lord wants to give every opportunity for conversion. We want to see at harvest time barns filled with wheat, not bundles of weeds on fire.

**Blessed Sacrament School** has been making preparations for reopening school for the coming school year. Our Principal Christie Bliven has worked very conscientiously to prepare a **Reopening Plan**. She has consulted widely with many different individuals and organizations to make the best and safest plan possible in a way that is adapted to the unique personality and needs of our school. This is an opening document that will be tweaked as we learn and adapt. Yet I believe this plan gives us a great start to have the opportunity for our children to be back into the classrooms again.

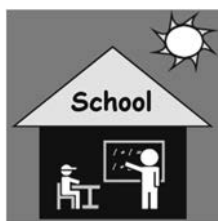


**Blessed Sacrament Staff Prepares for the 2020-2021 School Year Amid These Most Unprecedented Times**

## What the Month of July means to Catholics

Each month of the year has a devotional theme. The month of July the Catholics honor the Precious Blood of Jesus. July is an ideal time to connect our devotion to Jesus and Mary into deeper gratitude for the bond they share as well as to heighten our connection to the blood of the Lamb of God.

Here are a few ways you can align your life to the Precious Blood:

1. **Pray the Fatima Morning Offering** – Precious Blood of Jesus, save us! Immaculate Heart of Mary, pray for us! Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, have mercy on us! Amen.
2. **Spend some time in Eucharistic Adoration** – You can do this on Wednesdays here at church—focus on the reality of the presence of the blood of Christ in the Eucharist.
3. **Receive Communion** – and not just on **Sundays** – Consider going to Daily Mass or as often as you can this month. When we devoutly receive communion, we bring Christ into our hearts and He will become our lifeblood.
4. **Pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet Regularly** – The Divine Mercy Chaplet recalls the moment of Christ's Passion when one soldier thrust his lance into Jesus's side and immediately blood and water flowed out.
5. **Invoke St. Longinus in Prayer** – He is the centurion who stood facing Jesus and saw Him take his last breath and said, "Truly this man was the Son of God!" St. Longinus was nearly blind, was healed when some of the blood and water from Jesus fell into his eyes.
6. **Decorate the House in Honor of the Month's Devotion** – Place a vase of red flowers and/or red tablecloth on your table. Place an image of the face of Jesus in a prominent place where you gather as a family.
7. **Lead your Family in a Prayer to the Precious Blood** – Include this as part of your Grace before Meals or it may be said any time. It repeats. Through the merits of your precious blood and your Holy Face, O Jesus, grant us our petition."

## St. Junipero Serra

Miguel Jose Serra was born on the island of Mallorca, Spain. He took the name Junipero when he entered the Franciscan Order in 1730. Pope Francis canonized Junipero Serra during his visit to the U.S. on September 23, 2015. The celebration for the first Hispanic Saint of the U.S. was held on the lawn in front of the National Shrine in Washington, D.C.

He began his missionary work in South America and had a desire to convert native peoples in the New World. Arriving by ship at Vera Cruz, Mexico, he and a companion walked 250 miles to Mexico City. He became president of the missions there. Later he set out for the present-day Monterey, CA and founded the first mission after a 900 mile journey North of San Diego. He founded 9 missions on the West Coast. He sought the famous "Regulation" protecting the Indians and the missions in CA. It was the basis for the first significant legislation in CA, a "Bill of Rights" for Native Americans.

He suffered much during his life and lived with danger from non-Christian native peoples. His zeal to help others was fed by prayer each night. He brought the Native Americans the gift of faith and a decent standard of living. He won their love as was witnessed especially by their grief at his death. He is buried at Mission San Carlo Borromeo, Carmel, and was beatified in 1988.
