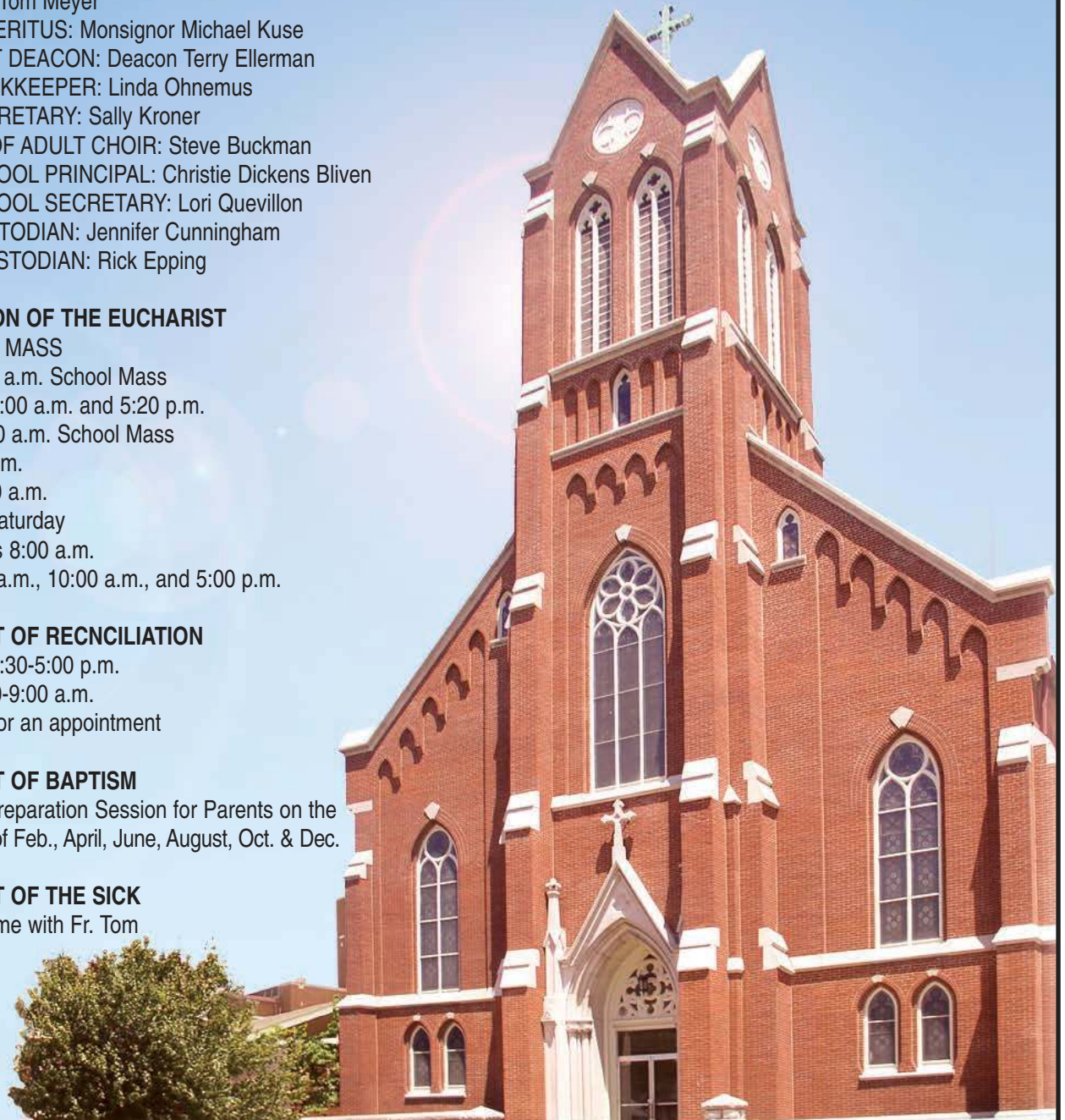

FATHER TOM'S COLUMN

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Today the Church celebrates the **28th Sunday in Ordinary Time**. In the Gospel today Jesus tells the **Parable of the Wedding Feast**. A King invites guests to a Wedding Feast for his son. Many who were invited ignored the invitation. The King instructs his servants to "invite to the feast (kingdom of heaven) whomever you find." The hall was then happily filled with guests! Yet one man did not bother to dress appropriately with a wedding garment, and was cast into the darkness outside. In this parable we wonder why the King's invitation was ignored by so many. Was it their own busyness and did they have plans already made? Or was there something lacking of

affection in their hearts for the King and his family. Many of our choices are rooted in the feelings of (dis-) affection we hold in our hearts. Are our hearts excited for the feast?

I would like to thank everyone who participated in our **Septemberfest Raffle**. I would like to share that the **Septemberfest Raffle netted a total of \$15,580** for our parish. This amount actually exceeded last year's net proceeds of \$15,142 from our "live" Septemberfest. Again I would like to thank the Pastoral Council for their leadership in coordinating our Raffle. I would also like to thank all who purchased and sold tickets. Our parish greatly thanks you for your generosity.

This weekend we will hear our annual **Lay Witness Talk in preparation for our annual Stewardship Sunday (October 25)**. We thank Anand and Denise Sangoi for their courage and witness that inspire us in our own journey of living stewardship.

Last week Blick's Construction was contracted to **Disassemble a large section of our Church Chimney** because the brick masonry of the chimney had fallen into disrepair. I thank the Buildings and Grounds Committee (Chair Mike Grant) for their leadership in addressing this church safety issue.

Last week's Annual Financial Report reminds us of our gratitude for the **Klene Family Trust which last year contributed \$166,509 to our Parish and School**. Without this gift, our parish would have experienced a deficit of (\$196,577). In gratitude our parish offers a weekly Mass intention for the Living and Deceased members of the Klene Family. Please say a prayer of gratitude in your hearts for this family's ongoing legacy of generosity to our parish.

Due to small attendance at our Friday morning 7:00 a.m. Mass, next week we will be moving **Friday morning Masses back to 8:00 a.m.** And because of the growing Spanish Mass attendance, Saturday morning Masses are moving to a weekly basis at 8:30 a.m.

Finally, **Parish Secretary Sally Kroner is announcing her Retirement effective November 30**. Sally has been an outstanding staff member here in our Parish Office and has been a tremendous resource to me personally as I continue to learn my way as pastor. Sally is excited for new future opportunities in retirement, but knows this is bittersweet as she loves her job here so very much! We are therefore posting the **Open position of Fulltime Parish Secretary**. Duties include receptionist duties, bulletin preparation and editing, maintenance of parish membership database, maintenance of parish calendar, recording of sacraments, completing sacramental forms, maintaining Mass stipend accounts, completing annual statistical reports, and many other administrative functions in support of parish ministry operations. Applicants who are interested can send their resumes to me here at Blessed Sacrament Parish with a deadline of **Friday, October 23**.

How to recite the Holy Rosary

1. SAY THESE PRAYERS...

IN THE NAME of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen. (*As you say this, with your right hand touch your forehead when you say Father, touch your breastbone when you say Son, touch your left shoulder when you say Holy, and touch your right shoulder when you say Spirit.*)

I BELIEVE IN GOD, the Father almighty, Creator of Heaven and earth. And in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, Who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate; was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into Hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into Heaven, and sits at the right hand of God, the Father almighty. He shall come again to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

OUR FATHER, Who art in Heaven, hallowed be Thy Name. Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in Heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.

HAIL MARY, full of grace, the Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

GLORY BE to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit. As it was in the beginning is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

O MY JESUS, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of Hell; lead all souls to Heaven, especially those in most need of Thy mercy. Amen.

HAIL HOLY QUEEN, mother of mercy; our life, our sweetness, and our hope. To thee do we cry, poor banished children of Eve. To thee do we send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this vale of tears. Turn, then, most gracious advocate, thine eyes of mercy toward us. And after this, our exile, show unto us the blessed fruit of thy womb, Jesus. O clement, O loving, O sweet Virgin Mary. Pray for us, O holy Mother of God, that we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ. Amen.

O GOD, WHOSE only-begotten Son by His life, death and resurrection, has purchased for us the rewards of eternal life; grant, we beseech Thee, that by meditating upon these mysteries of the Most Holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we may imitate what they contain and obtain what they promise, through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

ANNOUNCE each mystery by saying something like, "*The third Joyful Mystery is the Birth of Our Lord.*" This is required only when saying the Rosary in a group.

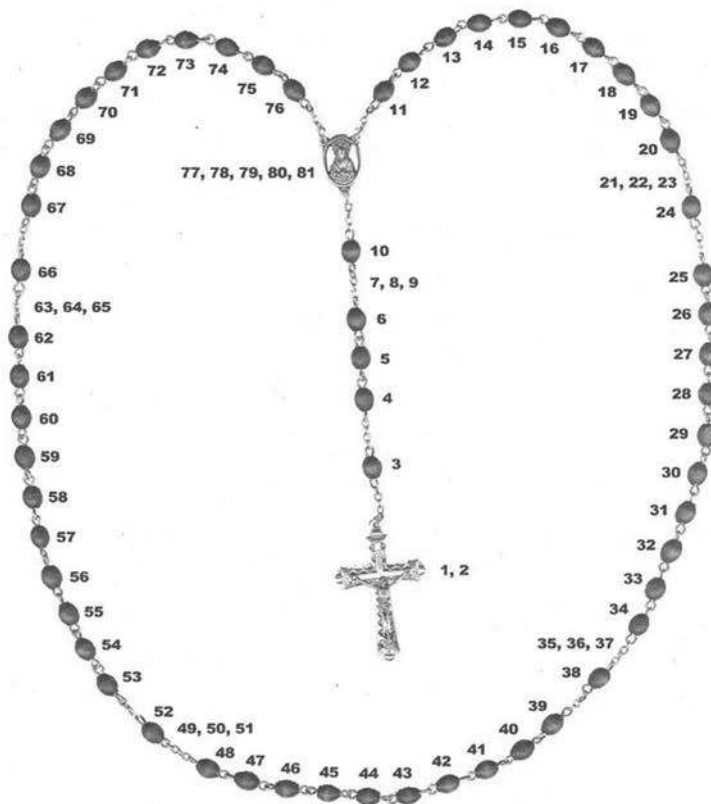

Celebrations

Columbus Day – is a national holiday of the Americas and elsewhere which officially celebrates the anniversary of Christopher Columbus's arrival in the Americas on October 12, 1492.

*We are all aware of Columbus Day but do you know all the **saints** we celebrate on October 12?*

1. St. Amicus – A French knight – companion of Ameluis.
2. St. Camilus Constanzi – A martyr of Japan – Originally from Italy – a Jesuit missionary in Japan.
3. St. Cosmas of Maiuma – Remembered as a great ecclesiastical poet—many of his compositions became a permanent part of the Byzantine liturgy.
4. St. Domnina of Anazarbus – Martyr who died in prison of Anazarbus.
5. St. Edistus – Martyr of Ravenna, Italy.
6. St. Edwin of Northumbria – Became Catholic after his marriage to Queen (St.) Ethelburga – was devout Catholic and brought peace to his kingdom – was slain in a military battle with irreligious Welch king and Pagan English warriors – Patron Saint of homeless, hobo's, and parents of large families.
7. St. Felix – Martyred bishop of Africa.
8. St. Fiacre – an Irish bishop—disciple of St. Patrick.
9. St. Heribert of Cologne – Patron St. of Rain –Archbishop of Cologne, Germany – performed miracles including ending a drought. He invoked for rains.
10. St. Maria Teresa Fasce – Born in Genoa, Italy – Became a nun at the Liguorian Augustinian Monastery – She is remembered as a great spiritual leader who suffered many illnesses.
11. St. Pantalus – Bishop and martyr of Basel, Switzerland.
12. St. Seraphinus – Entered the Capuchins and was a spiritual advisor – He was graced with considerable spiritual gifts and wisdom as well as devotion to the Blessed Sacrament. Gave counsel to many leaders.
