FATHER TOM'S COLUMN

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Today the Church celebrates the **29th Sunday in Ordinary Time**. In the Gospel today the Pharisees are testing Jesus with the question, "Is it lawful to pay the census tax to Caesar or not?" Jesus invites them to identify the image on the coin itself... "Caesar's." Jesus responds, "Then repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God." As Christians we are reminded that we live *in* this world but we are not *of* this world. As Christians our citizenship is in heaven and that is our truest identity. Yet since we are living in this world, we are called to obey the legitimate authority of this world, in the hopes that Jesus will transform the world

through us. We hope that our own examples as Christians can point a light to all in this world toward the Kingdom that really matters.

This Sunday I will give my own **Witness Talk in preparation for our annual Stewardship Sunday next Sunday, October 25**. In the next few days please be looking in the mail for your annual Blessed Sacrament Stewardship booklet for each household to fill out and return back. We ask you to either mail back your Stewardship form to the Parish Office, or return in to the designated location in the Gathering Space next Sunday.

Thank you for your gift of stewardship to our Lord here at Blessed Sacrament Parish.

This weekend is the kickoff of the Springfield Diocesan **Season of Stewardship**, formerly known as the Annual Catholic Services Appeal (ACSA). This is a diocesan appeal whereby the Springfield Diocese raises funds to administer the Diocese and provide for the education of our future priests. The goal this year for Blessed Sacrament Parish is **\$90,536**. Parish members will receive a letter this week from Bishop Thomas Paprocki inviting you to make a contribution to this appeal. I ask that each parish household might **consider making a minimum gift of \$300** (\$50 per month for 6 months). I recognize that many of our parish households cannot afford this level, and that's okay. Other parish families can afford something more, which can help us together as a parish family to reach our goal. I sincerely thank you for your gift to our Diocesan Church of Springfield in Illinois.

A project that Fr. Chris Comerford had wanted to complete was **Moving the Wooden Structure holding the Tabernacle** from the rear room of the church back to the High Altar. An anonymous donor has given a donation to make this physical transfer possible. We are therefore moving forward on Fr. Chris' vision. Mike Grant and the Buildings and Grounds Committee are in the process of finalizing the bids with a local contractor. We hope to soon communicate a timeline for this process.

A reminder that we are offering **Holy Communion every Sunday at 12:00 Noon** for anyone not quite ready to come back to public Mass. Please contact Sally at the Parish Office to sign up.

Finally, **Parish Secretary Sally Kroner is announcing her Retirement effective December 4**. We are therefore posting the **Open position of Fulltime Parish Secretary**. Duties include receptionist duties, bulletin preparation and editing, maintenance of parish membership database, maintenance of parish calendar, recording of sacraments, completing sacramental forms, maintaining Mass stipend accounts, completing annual statistical reports, and many other administrative functions in support of parish ministry operations. Applicants who are interested can send their resumes to me here at Blessed Sacrament Parish with a deadline of **Friday, October 30**.

She stated:

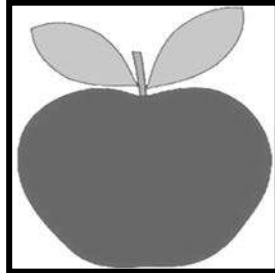
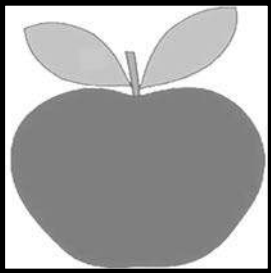

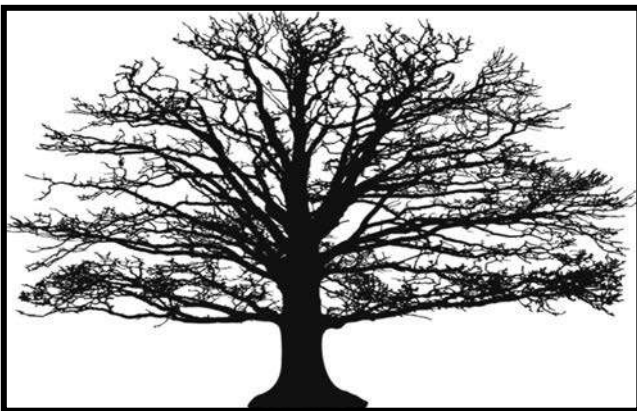

Double the Money — Double the Impact!!

The Quincy Catholic Elementary Schools (QCES) Foundation is humbled to announce it is the recipient of a "\$25,000 Challenge Grant" from the Tracy Family Foundation (TFF). Saints for the Week

Monday, October 19 St. John de Brebeuf and St. Isaac Jogues – Jesuits. St. John de Brebeuf founded schools and wrote a catechism and dictionary in the Huron language. St. Isaac was made a slave after being captured. When he escaped, he went back to France.

Tuesday, October 20 St. Paul of the Cross – Born in Italy, one of 16 children. Began suffering for Jesus at age 15. At age 21 God called him to form a group of men dedicated to preaching missions. They were called Passionists. He received gifts of prophecy and healing from the Holy Spirit.

Thursday, October 22 St. John Paul II, Pope – Born Karol Jozef Wojtyla in Wadowice, Poland. Ordained on November 1, 1946 – Bishop 1958 – Archbishop 1964 – Pope 1978 – First pilgrimage to Poland 1979 – Attempt on his life 1981 – April 2, 2005 Entered eternal life.

Friday, October 23 St. John of Capistrano – Became a governor of Perugia, Italy. When in jail as a political prisoner, converted and joined the Franciscans. He preached all over Italy.

Saturday, October 24 St. Anthony Mary Claret, Bishop – A well liked Spanish priest. His family had a deep love and devotion to Jesus and Mary. Anthony was assigned Archbishop of Cuba. After 8 years he went to Spain and wrote 200 books and pamphlets. After the revolution in 1886, returned to a monastery in France where he died.

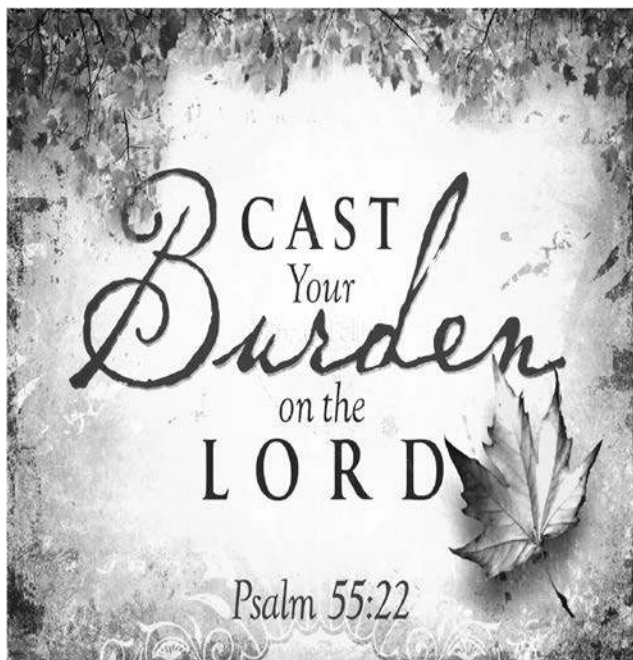

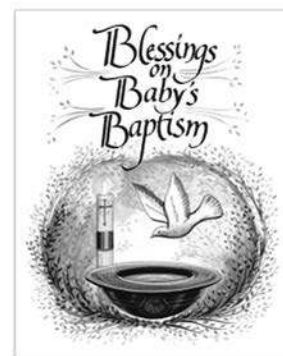
