FATHER TOM'S COLUMN

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Today we celebrate the **1st Sunday of Advent**. We bless our Advent wreath today and light our first of four Advent candles. This season of Advent is a hope-filled season which speaks to us about the three Comings of Christ: history, mystery, and glory. It is Christ's Second Coming in Glory that our liturgy points us toward on this opening Sunday of Advent. Jesus uses the analogy of the flood in the days of Noah to describe His final coming. "They were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage... They did not know until the flood came and carried them all away." Jesus therefore admonishes us to "stay awake!" especially being careful not to let our "house be broken into." This Advent what are the thoughts and feelings that I want to be more careful of not letting into the house of my soul?

On Friday, December 4 and Monday, December 7 we will celebrate **Advent Penance Services for our students in Blessed Sacrament School and PSR**. This will be a wonderful opportunity for our Grades 3-8 students to open their hearts to Jesus and encounter His mercy and forgiveness.

In an effort to give Holy Communion to those not yet comfortable coming to Mass, I am offering a very brief **Communion Service each Sunday at 11:15 a.m.** These weekly Communion Services are being offered to bring the Body of Christ to those who have not been attending for fear of the Coronavirus.

Finally, we will soon be welcoming our new **Director of Faith Formation, Ginny Steinkamp**, to our parish of Blessed Sacrament. The past few months Ginny has been completing her final semester in college at Benedictine College (Atchison, KS) in anticipation of joining us in December as our new Director. We very much look forward to having Ginny join us!

Have you ever felt like your faith life is out of sync with your busy everyday calendar? Like somehow what you are seeing in stores and feeling in your faith life is incongruous? That is because most mainstream social celebrations have been altered through the years to fit into social calendars instead of a liturgical calendar, and while it is not necessarily a bad thing, it can create confusion and disharmonious feelings.

The USCCB publishes a liturgical calendar each year that is the basis for the readings in mass, sacraments, special saint feast days, holy days of obligation, and church celebrations throughout the year. Each liturgical season is centered around the mysteries of Jesus' birth, death, resurrection, and everything in between. The Catechism of the Catholic Church tells us that "liturgy" in the Christian tradition means participation of the People of God in "the work of God", and goes on to specify that liturgy is the "...communion in Christ between God and men. It engages the faithful in the new life of the community and involves the "conscious, active, and fruitful participation" of everyone." Celebrating and living our lives with the liturgical calendar can deepen your faith and create a harmonious rhythm in your faith, family, and social life.

December 25th- Christmas Day

January 1st- Solemnity of Mary

August 15th- Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

November 1st- All Saints Day



The liturgical year begins with the first Sunday of Advent (the Sunday on or closest to November 30th). This year, it starts on Sunday, November 29th, 2020 and will end Sunday, November 28, 2021. For a comprehensive calendar please visit <https://www.usccb.org/resources/2021-liturgical-calendar>. These next couple of weeks are a great time to break out the Advent wreath and Advent decorations, and plan a Liturgical New Year party! Celebrate the new liturgical new year with your family, plan a game night, make everyone's favorite foods, just do something special to mark the occasion! Our family has marked the tradition the last couple of years by coming together as a family and setting intentions and goals to create a "family prayer" that we say at meal times after the dinner prayer throughout the year. Be creative!

In contrast with what we see in stores covered in red and green, Advent is a time of solemnity and preparation, which is symbolized by the color Purple in the Catholic Church. It is sometimes referred to as "mini Lent". It is entirely okay if you have already broken out the Christmas decorations (nobody is trying to rain on your parade!), but it is important to incorporate the spirit of Advent as well and prepare our homes, hearts, and minds for the coming of Jesus.

So this sounds like a LOT of information and can seem like another "to-do" to add to your already full calendar, but I promise it's not an all-or-nothing approach! Liturgical living can be easy! Start small, like choosing a saint whose feast day falls in that month to celebrate a meal with, decorate your house according to the liturgical colors/calender, or just choose a saint from the month to pray through their intercessions. Also, liturgical living is also celebrating the Sacraments as often as you can! Best of all, the liturgical calendar is so full that each year God can reveal something new and different to you about a particular season or saint year after year. Below is a basic diagram of how the liturgical calendar is created. I urge all of you to utilize this time of year to try to incorporate liturgical living in your life!

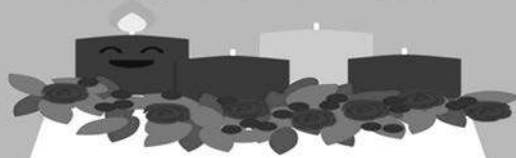
