## FATHER TOM'S COLUMN

### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Today the Church celebrates the **32<sup>nd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time**. In the Gospel Jesus tells the **Parable of the Ten Virgins**. While waiting for the bridegroom who was delayed, five wise virgins brought flasks of oil for their lamps and five foolish virgins did not. When the Bridegroom arrived, only the wise were ready. Only they were allowed into the wedding feast, while the foolish were stuck knocking at the door. Jesus summarizes, "Therefore, stay awake, for you know neither the day nor the hour." Jesus is the Bridegroom who is delayed

in bringing forth the Wedding Feast of Heaven. His arrival is the End of Time or the end of our own personal times here on earth. Jesus preaches that we should be prepared for that moment. If Jesus arrived today, is there anything specific I would regret not having completed?

We have the results of our **2020 October Count**. According to our numbers we had an average weekend Mass attendance of **388 persons**, which is really quite good given the COVID safety restrictions and limitations we continue to maintain. Below are the average attendance results for each individual Mass time. I thank our usher teams for their continued good work!

Next Sunday, November 15 we will celebrate the **Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick at all of our Sunday Masses**. We will offer this sacrament to anyone wishing to receive this sacramental anointing which brings healing to both body and soul. For anyone not comfortable receiving this sacrament in the context of a large crowd present at Mass, I will also offer this sacrament privately on this same Sunday at 11:15 a.m. in Church.

In an effort to give Holy Communion to those not yet comfortable coming back to Mass, I am offering a very brief **Communion Service each Sunday at 11:15 a.m.** These weekly Communion Services are being offered to bring the Body of Christ to those who have not been attending for fear of the Coronavirus.

The Springfield Diocesan **Season of Stewardship** has given Blessed Sacrament Parish the goal of **\$90,536**. I ask that each parish household might **consider making a minimum gift of \$300 (\$25 per month for 12 months)**. I sincerely thank you for your gift to our Diocesan Church of Springfield in Illinois.

Because of a generous donation from an anonymous parish donor, we will be putting in **New Outer Church Doors on the 7<sup>th</sup> Street and Adams Street sides of church**. These doors will have panic bars, thus allowing safe exiting when our church doors are locked. I would like to thank Mike Grant and the Buildings and Grounds Committee for their fine work in organizing this project.

Finally, I am **Happy to be back after a brief quarantine** which required me to miss celebrating Mass last weekend and for the Annual Mass of Remembrance. Over the last two weeks our Blessed Sacrament School has been engaged in online learning due to a number of positive cases of the Coronavirus that were reported. So truly a number of our adults and students have been in and out of quarantine recently. I am very much looking forward to school being back in person starting tomorrow. This parish campus is not the same when our students and staff are not here. It's remarkable how much our school brings our parish so much life!

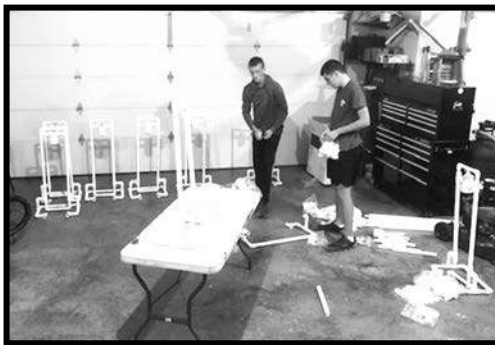

## Veterans Day

Veterans Day is a time for us to pay our respects to those who have served. For one day, we stand united in respect for you, our veterans.

This holiday started as a day to reflect upon the heroism of those who died in our country's service and was originally called Armistice Day. An Act approved May 13, 1938, made the 11th of November in each year a legal holiday – a day to be dedicated to the cause of world peace and to be known as "Armistice Day". The day the Armistice was signed at the end of World War I.

After World War II had required the greatest mobilization of soldiers and sailors in the Nation's history and the American forces had fought aggression in Korea, the 83rd Congress, at the urging of the veterans service organizations, amended the Act of 1938 by striking out the word "Armistice" and inserting the word "**Veterans**". With approval of this legislation on June 1, 1954, November 11 became a day to honor American veterans of all wars.

## St. Leo the Great

St. Leo the Great – feast day November 10 – was Bishop of Rome from 29 September 440 until his death. Pope Benedict XVI said that Leo's papacy "was undoubtedly one of the most important in the Church's history."



He was a Roman aristocrat, and was the first pope to have been called "the Great". He is perhaps best known for having met Attila the Hun in 452 and allegedly persuaded him to turn back from his invasion of Italy. He is also a Doctor of the Church, most remembered theologically for issuing the Tome of Leo, a document which was a major foundation to the debates of the Ecumenical Council of Chalcedon. The Council of Chalcedon, the Fourth Ecumenical Council, dealt primarily with Christology, and elucidated the orthodox definition of Christ's being as the hypostatic union of two natures, divine and human, united in one person, "with neither confusion nor division". It was followed by a major schism associated with Monophysitism, Miaphysitism and Dyophysitism.

Leo died on November 10, 461 and wished to be buried as close to St. Peter as possible. His body was placed in a tomb in the portico of St. Peter's basilica. In 688 his remains were moved inside the basilica itself.
