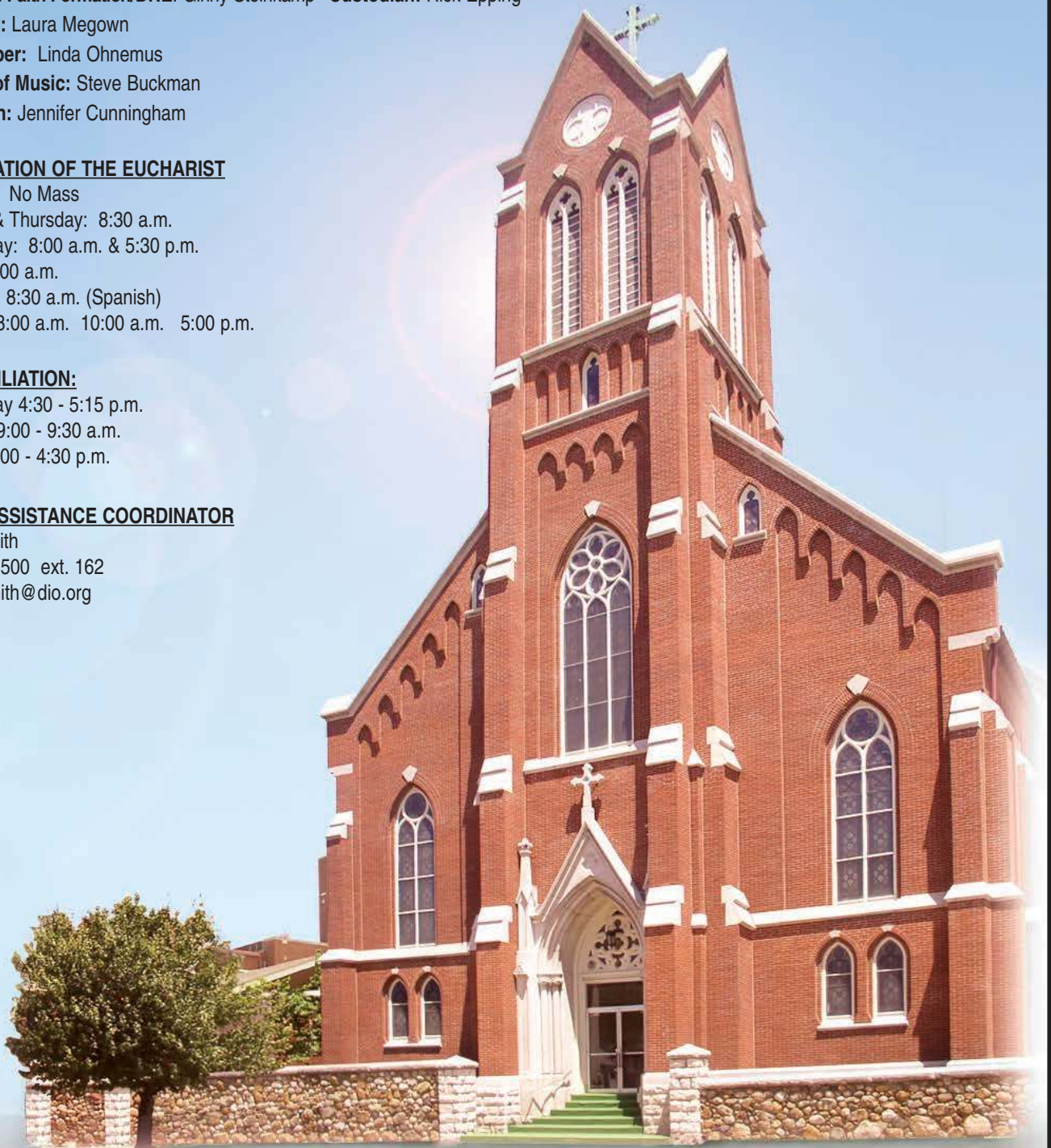

Today we celebrate the **6th Sunday in Ordinary Time**. In the gospel Jesus heals a man with leprosy. According to the laws of the Old Testament those with leprosy were to be excluded from society. "He shall dwell apart, making his abode outside the camp." Jesus' heart was moved with pity for this heartbreaking situation, and brings healing. We pray that our own hearts may have an awareness for those who carry hidden wounds of separation. We too wish to be ministers of healing.

From the Pastor's Desk

The season of **Lent** should include the following elements for us to focus upon: (1) Fasting – giving up something we like; (2) Prayer; and (3) Charity – doing charitable works for others and donating money to charity. Blessed Sacrament will provide several liturgical and devotional opportunities each week during Lent to assist you in your spiritual growth during this Lenten season.

The following are the **Lenten regulations** for Catholics to observe.

Abstinence – Everyone 14 years of age and over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.

Fast – Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 is required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Only one full meatless meal, and two much smaller meatless meals, are permitted. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are allowed.

To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.

This coming Lent our parish is recommending a new video Bible series, "**Parousia: The Bible and the Mass,**" produced by **Scott Hahn and the St. Paul Center for Biblical Theology**. It is a 10-episode video series, each video 30 minutes in length, which opens up the teachings on the Eucharist as found in both the Old and New Testament. This video series is being offered free by the St. Paul Center only during the upcoming season of Lent. Please go to stpaulcenter.com to order your free episodes which you can watch on your own smartphone or computer. At Blessed Sacrament we are offering the opportunity to watch these episodes in five weekly 1-hour video sessions here in church, where you can watch these episodes with fellow parish members.

A 30-minute optional "**Question and Answer**" session will be offered immediately following the videos (**7:30-8:00 p.m.**), with Ginny Steinkamp and I answering questions on the content of the video. Please consider this wonderful opportunity for faith development during this upcoming season of Lent.

Next Sunday, February 21 at 2:30 p.m., our RCIA catechumens travel to Springfield for the **Rite of Election**. At this celebration, Bishop Thomas Paprocki officially welcomes all catechumens into the order of the "Elect". Next weekend we will celebrate a Rite of Sending before their departure. We pray for our RCIA catechumens and candidates as they begin their final preparations for the Easter sacraments.

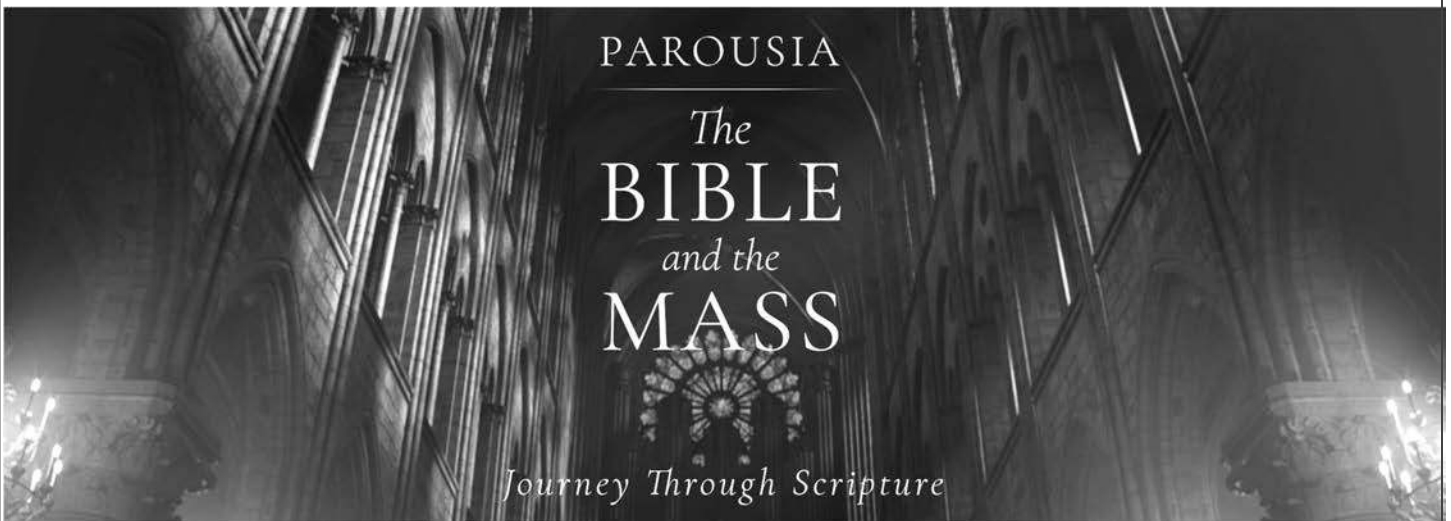

The box is in place for anyone to use, as needed. We like to say, Take if you Need, Leave if you can. You never have to completely fill the pantry, just add a few items when you shop. It's an easy place for children or neighbors who may not be able to get to a store or traditional food pantry.

Brandon and Jessica Edgar started this in Quincy several years ago and the Quincy Neighborhood Federation continued their efforts when they moved out of state.

Items should be easy to prepare or ready to eat. Nothing sharp, no alcohol or medication. Preferable nothing home-made (especially during COVID). If you wouldn't eat it when you were hungry, others probably wouldn't either.

Favored items are: Cereal, individual oatmeal packets (open boxes and put packages in separately), pop tarts, breakfast bars or granola bars, packets of hot chocolate, etc. Peanut butter, canned pastas, tuna, mac & cheese cups or boxes, canned or boxed soups, jarred spaghetti sauce, etc., are great for meals. Crackers, crackers/peanut butter, fruit snacks, fruit cups, applesauce, pudding, etc. Toilet paper, soap, tooth brushes, toothpaste, deodorant are great items too. Fresh fruits/fresh vegetables are awesome but the weather is a factor on when you can add these items.

Gear your donations to a certain age group. 1) easy to prepare or ready to eat for younger kids; 2) ready to eat (no cooking or can openers) for homeless; 3) soft or easy to eat items for seniors.
