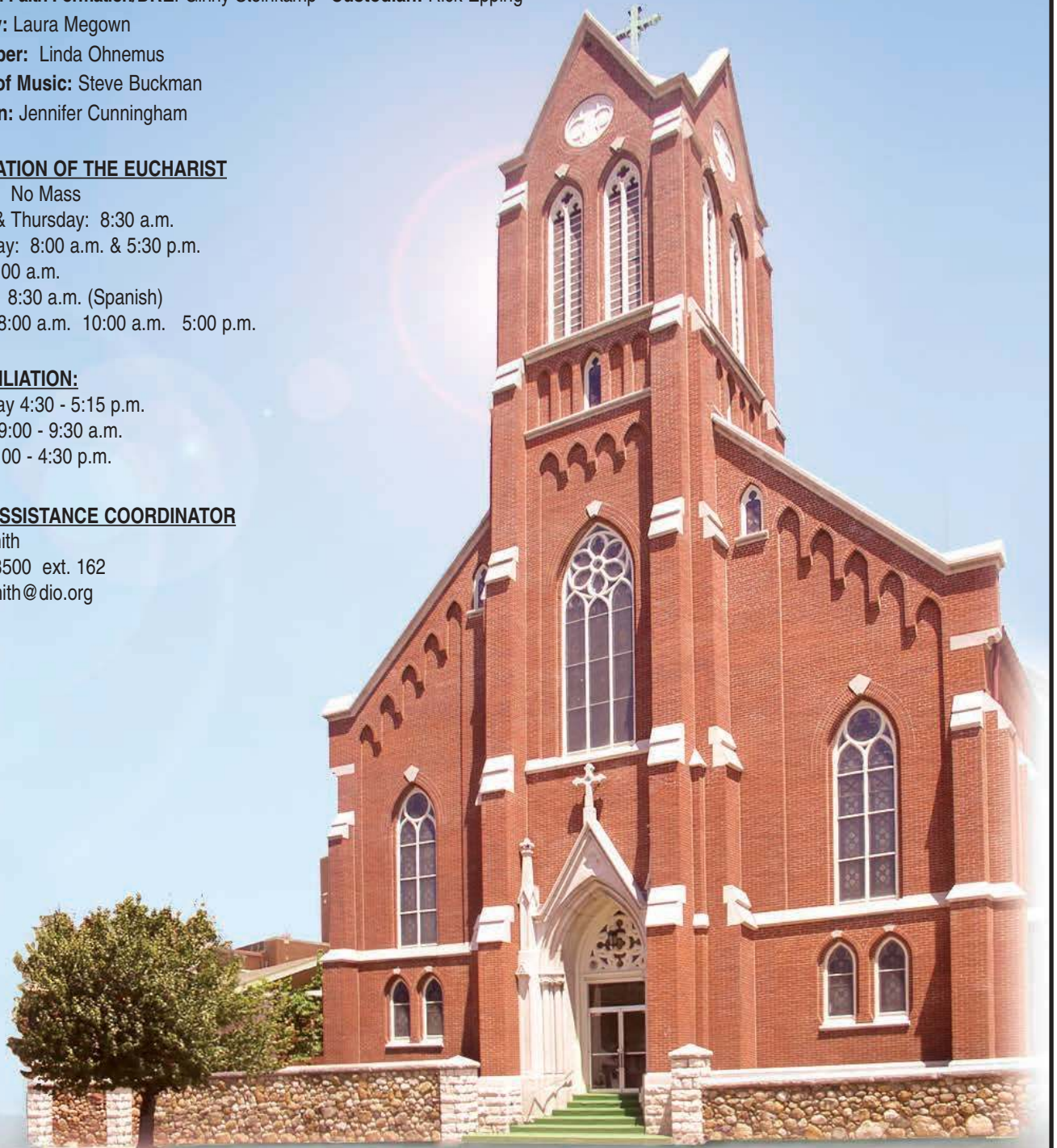

Blessed Sacrament will provide several liturgical and devotional opportunities each week during Lent to assist you in your spiritual growth during this Lenten season.

Finally, this Tuesday we celebrate **1st Reconciliation for all of our 2nd Grade students**. Please pray for our 2nd Grade students that they might have a wonderful first encounter with the power of God's mercy in their lives.

Rite of Election

This year we have three catechumens preparing to be fully initiated in the Church. Catechumens are unbaptized people seeking to join the Catholic Church. They undergo a year long process of study and formation in order to prepare themselves to receive this awesome gift. Father and son, Mike and Kaileb Baker along with Blake Meyers will be fully initiated into the Church on the Easter Vigil this year.

On Sunday, February 21, all three Catechumens and their sponsors will attend the Rite of Election in Springfield, Illinois, with Bishop Paprocki. There, they will join all Catechumens from the Diocese of Springfield to be presented before the Bishop. The sponsors will affirm that the catechumens are prepared and worthy to receive the Sacraments of Initiation.

Also in formation are our candidates. These are individuals who have been baptized either in the Catholic Church or a different ecclesial community. Natalie Zimmerman and Kelly Baker, who have also joined the RCIA formation process, will be fully initiated at the Easter Vigil. Mia Baker and Katelynn Meyers will be baptized at the Easter Vigil as well. Also in formation are Benjamin Allison and Eric Arnold, candidates who will receive full initiation at a later date.

Please keep all Catechumens, but especially those in our parish family, in your prayers. We are overjoyed to officially welcome these new family members this Easter!

Saints Who Inspire in Times of Need

St. Valentine

If you're struggling in your relationship or are in need of help when it comes to your love life, know that you can turn to St. Valentine who is the patron saint of love. Believers say God worked through his life to perform miracles and teach people how to recognize and experience true love. This famous saint, an Italian doctor who later became a priest, inspired the creation of the Valentine's Day holiday. He was sent to jail for performing weddings for couples during a time when new marriages were outlawed in ancient Rome. Before he was killed for refusing to renounce his faith, he sent a loving farewell note to a young blind girl he had been helping to teach. She was the daughter of his jailer, and that note eventually led to the tradition of sending Valentine's cards. Believers say that God miraculously cured Julia of her blindness so that she could personally read the Valentine's note, rather than just have someone else read it to her.

St. Dominic Savio

St. Dominic Savio is a powerful intercessor that can protect those of all ages. If you are worried about your rebellious teenager, you can turn to St. Dominic. He was a bright kid who met St. John Bosco at the age of 12 and attended his school. As an ordinary and fun-loving boy, he sometimes got into trouble for laughing too much in the classroom. He loved to play games, but also devoted long hours to prayer. One day Dominic encountered two boys arguing and on the verge of a dangerous fight. They were going to throw stones at each other until Dominic intervened. Dominic was a beacon of light to his classmates and helped many of them turn their lives around and back to God. He died at the age of 15 due to a severe, unidentified illness, and was later canonized for displaying such heroic faith.
