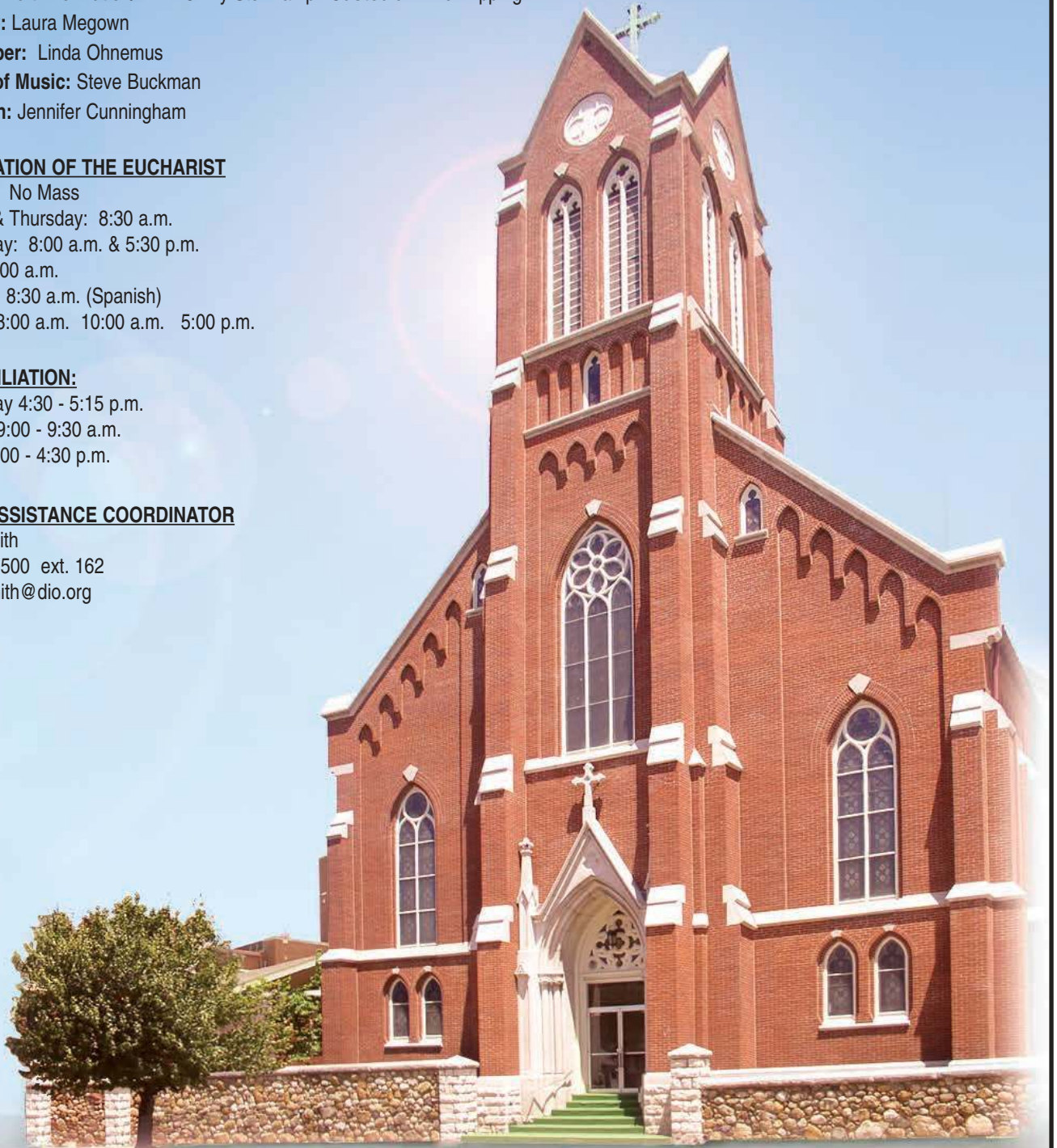

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Today we celebrate the 2nd Sunday of Lent. In the gospel we hear the story of the Transfiguration. Jesus is transformed before his disciples in order to strengthen them for the challenging journey ahead. This is a journey that will lead to the cross on Calvary. We ask the Lord this Sunday for his continued strengthening during our own Lenten journey of repentance and transformation . . . a journey that too has its own cross.

The season of Lent should include the following elements for us to focus upon: (1) Fasting – giving up something we like; (2) Prayer; and (3) Charity – doing charitable works for others and donating money to charity. Blessed Sacrament will provide several liturgical and devotional opportunities each week during Lent to assist you in your spiritual growth during this Lenten season.

Next weekend our RCIA elect begin the **Scrutinies**. The Church teaches that the Scrutinies are “rites for self-searching and repentance...The Scrutinies are meant to uncover, then heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts of the elect.” We pray that our elect and candidates may join us throughout Lent to reflect on their own weaknesses and find healing in God’s grace and mercy.

This season of Lent our parish is recommending a new video Bible series, “**Parousia: The Bible and the Mass,**” produced by **Scott Hahn and the St. Paul Center for Biblical Theology**. It is a 10-episode video series, each video 30 minutes in length. This video series is being offered free by the St. Paul Center only during the season of Lent. At Blessed Sacrament we are offering the opportunity to watch these episodes in five weekly 1-hour video sessions here in church, where you can watch these episodes with fellow parish members.

- Fri. March 12 @ 6:30-7:30 p.m. Episodes 7 & 8**
- Fri. March 19 @ 6:30-7:30 p.m. (Optional Q & A)**
- Fri. March 26 @ 6:30-7:30 p.m. Episodes 9 & 10**

A 30-minute optional “**Question and Answer**” session will be offered immediately following the videos (**7:30-8:00 p.m.**), with Ginny Steinkamp and I answering questions on the content of the video.

Finally, next Sunday Quincy Notre Dame kicks off their Annual Fund with a talk at all Masses by current QND students. As a 1986 alumnus of QND, I can personally attest to the value of a QND education. I ask that parish members listen with your hearts next week to the testimony provided by our QND students. We hope that we all might respond generously to the QND Annual Fund Drive.

Reconciliation

Confession is an act of honesty and courage – an act of entrusting ourselves, beyond sin, to the mercy of a loving and forgiving God.

-Pope St. John Paul II

Why go to the Sacrament of Reconciliation?

The Sacraments are moments where we encounter the life of Christ. Pope Leo the Great says, “Our Redeemer’s visible presence has passed into the sacraments.” In the Sacrament of Reconciliation, we encounter profound Divine Mercy. This forgiveness enables us to live peacefully and forgive others as well. It is important to note that when we are in a state of serious sin, we must first go to Reconciliation before receiving the Eucharist.

1 Corinthians 11:27 says, “For anyone who eats and drinks without discerning the body eats and drinks judgment on himself.” The Sacrament of Reconciliation clears away the grime of sin in our hearts so that they may be tabernacles for the Lord to dwell in.

It has been a while since I went to Reconciliation, what do I do?

First as you enter the confessional and kneel, say “Bless me Father for I have sinned, my last confession was (insert how long approximately it has been 1 month, 1 year, 1 decade, etc.). Then you will list your sins in number and kind. We give the approximate number or how frequently this is a sin we struggle with. For example, one might say, “I take the Lord’s name in vain several times a week. The

priest might give some words of counsel or encouragement and then he will ask you to make an Act of Contrition which can sound something like the following, “My God, I am sorry for my sins with all my heart. In choosing to do wrong and failing to do good, I have sinned against you whom I should love above all things. I firmly intend, with your help, to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid whatever leads me to sin. Our Savior Jesus Christ suffered and died for us. In his name, my God, have mercy.” Then, the priest will give you a penance – usually a series of prayers and absolution. It is best that the penance is completed before you leave the church. That way you don’t accidentally forget. We want to not just tell God we are sorry, but show Him.

When does Blessed Sacrament offer the Sacrament of Reconciliation?

Lent is a great time to receive this Sacrament. It is a way to “Turn away from sin and believe in the Gospel.” The Blessed Sacrament Reconciliation Schedule is as follows:

Wednesday: 4:30-5:00 p.m.

Saturday: 9:00-9:30 a.m.

Sunday: 4:00-4:30 p.m.

5 Practices for a More Fruitful Lent

This is a perfect time to try a new form of sacrifice or to enrich your prayer life. Here are five ways to make the most of Lent this year.

Every year our Catholic faith gives us 40 days to imitate Jesus’ time of prayer and fasting in the desert (Luke 4:1-2). This is a perfect time to try a new form of sacrifice or to enrich your prayer life. A bigger challenge is to continue to incorporate one or two of these practices throughout the year.

The Church requires us to fast only two days each year—Ash Wednesday and Good Friday—but we can certainly undertake this penitential sacrifice more frequently. Make it a practice to eat only bread and water or to drink only liquids until dinner on Fridays during Lent. (Don’t forget that abstinence from meat is required of Catholics on Lenten Fridays.)

Most parishes pray the Stations on Fridays during Lent as a group. If you are unable to attend, find some quiet time during the week to visit your church and prayerfully follow Jesus in these 14 events of His Passion and Crucifixion.

Go through your closets and pantry to find clothes, toys, food and other items to donate to the poor. You might also volunteer your time to a charity or visit the sick in a hospital or nursing home. Perhaps you can give up some luxury or habit during Lent and make a donation with the money you saved.

Ask the Holy Spirit to help you know, understand and live the Word of God as you prayerfully read through the gospels. Spend extra time in prayer and meditation as you read the four different accounts of Jesus’ Passion and death.














Spending an hour in prayer in front of the Blessed Sacrament is so pleasing to our Savior. “So you could not keep watch with me for one hour? Watch and pray that you may not undergo the test.” (Matthew 26:40-41) If this is a new practice for you, an online search or a visit to a Catholic bookstore will turn up plenty of resources for prayers and meditations for a Holy Hour.
