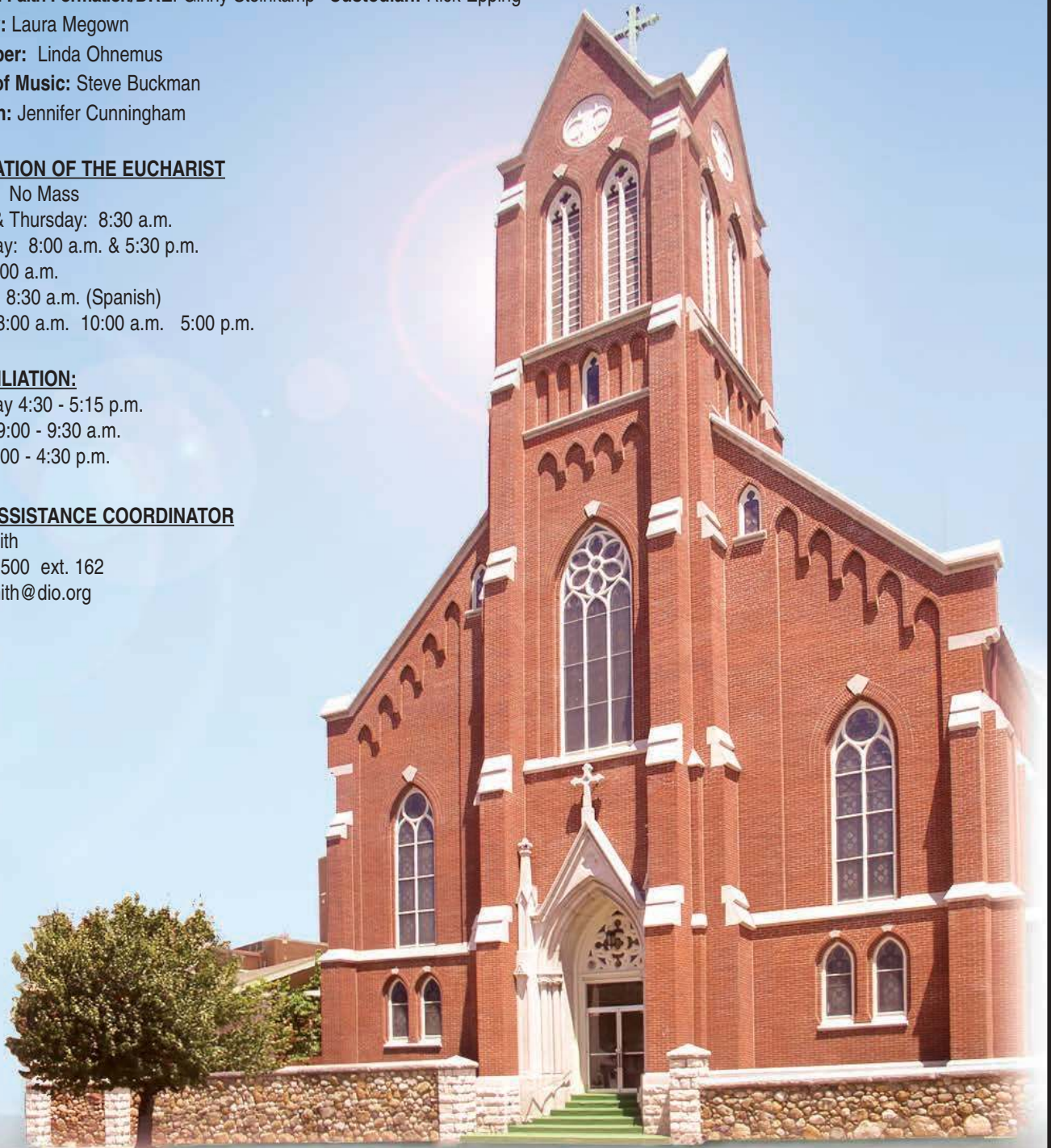

Fr. Tom's Column

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Today we celebrate the 5th Sunday in Ordinary Time. In the Gospel today we see Jesus perform a miraculous healing of Peter's mother-in-law. This is in contrast to our First Reading where Job is seen struggling with the severity of life. "So I have been assigned months of misery." Why does God allow suffering? I believe that for those who bring faith to their struggles, Jesus comes in the same way he came to Peter's mother-in-law. "He approached, grasped her hand, and helped her up." We seek to reach for the hand of Jesus.

This coming Lent our parish will be recommending a new video Bible series, "**Parousia: The Bible and the Mass,**" produced by **Scott Hahn and the St. Paul Center for Biblical Theology**. It is a 10-episode video series, each video 30 minutes in length, which opens up the teachings on the Eucharist as found in both the Old and New Testament. This video series is being offered free by the St. Paul Center only during the upcoming season of Lent. At Blessed Sacrament we are working on the logistics of hosting five weekly 1-hour video sessions where you can come watch the episodes with fellow parish members. An optional 30-minute "Question and Answer" session will follow for those who wish to stay. More information will be available next week. Finally, next weekend **Msgr. Mike Kuse will preside at all of our weekend Masses**. I will be traveling this coming week for some vacation time before Lent officially begins in 10 days.

Modification for the Distribution of Ashes

In light of coronavirus pandemic mitigation efforts, the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments published a modification to the way ashes will be distributed on Ash Wednesday, February 17.

Regardless, it is important to remain reverent when receiving ashes despite this change.

The modifications are the following:

- Ashes will be blessed and sprinkled with holy water as usual.
- Rather than the priest saying one of the two formulae (“Remember you are dust and to dust you shall return.” or “Turn away from sin and live the Gospel”) to each penitent, it will be said to the entire congregation at the beginning.
- Distributors will wash hands and put on a face mask.
- Each Penitent will come forward and silently have the Ashes imposed on their head by sprinkling on the top of the head.

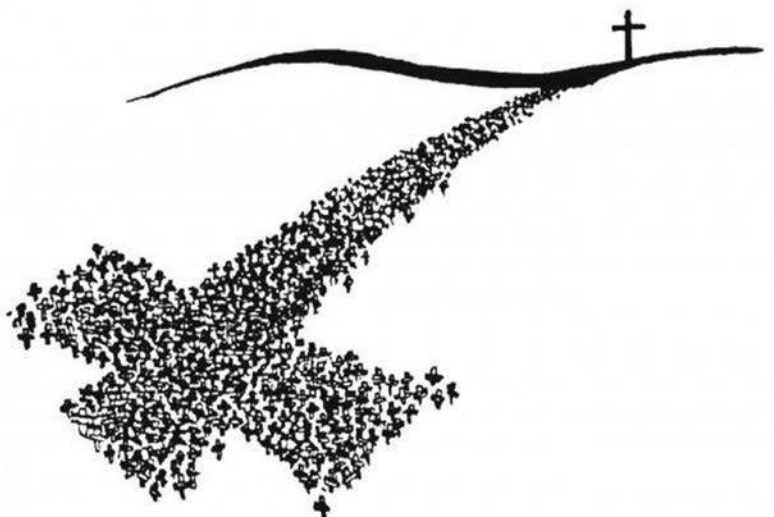
It is sometimes difficult to accept even small changes in what is traditional to us, but it is worth noting that the practice of imposing ashes in the sign of the cross is not universally practiced by most of the world and throughout most of Church history. It is even Biblical to impose ashes by sprinkling on the top of the head as it is seen in the Old Testament such as in Joshua 6:7.

The Tradition of Ash Wednesday and its Signification

Ash Wednesday is a penitential practice in the Catholic Church that begins the Lenten season, a time of fasting, penitence, prayer, and preparation for the Resurrection of Jesus Christ at Easter.

In the fourth century, the practice of public penance or recognition of our sinfulness was common. Penitents would dress in sack cloth and have ashes sprinkled on their heads. Between the eighth and tenth century, this practice became less common as private confession and penance gained greater favor. The current practice of receiving ashes at the beginning of Lent began in the eleventh century, but all of these practices are rooted even deeper in the ancient Jewish penitential practice of sprinkling ashes as a sign of repenting from a life of sin.

The ashes themselves are reminders of expressed sorrow and contrition as well as the fleetingness and frailty of human life. It is a humble recognition that God out of his goodness sustains us and holds into existence. The Latin phrase, “memento mori” meaning “remember your death” is a common utterance of the Benedictine monastic order. While this may seem uncomfortable and maybe even morbid, it is an invitation to live our life in light of each moment being a gift from God. The only moment promised to us is the present. Are we living lives that would prepare us to enter into heaven if Christ called us home 1 minute from now? In many ways, Ash Wednesday is our annual reminder of this “memento mori” attitude.

A Saint Who Persevered
When you are facing hardship, remember
this saint.

Sometimes, in life, we face uphill battles. Even if we feel called by God to do something great, it might seem to be an impossible task. There are too many obstacles. There are too many people who say it can't be done. Frequently, we stand in our own way. We fear that if others haven't been able to accomplish it, how can we possibly believe that we can do it?

Fortunately, we can look to the saints for inspiration. Although all saints have persevered in living a holy life and being amazing examples of how to love and serve God, many of them also faced those uphill battles. Some had to rise above prejudiced societies. Others had to escape captivity. Despite the obstacles they faced, they didn't give up. Here is one of the seven saints who persevered in the face of adversity.

Saint Patrick

While Saint Patrick most likely didn't rid Ireland of snakes as the legend goes, he accomplished something far greater for the country. He is said to have brought Christianity to several thousand people in fifth-century Ireland, transforming it from a pagan country to a Christian one. He also founded many churches and monasteries there.

The Romano-British saint once wrote "Wherefore those in Ireland who never had the knowledge of God, but until now only worshiped idols and abominations, from them has been lately prepared a people of the Lord, and they are called children of God."

But the Catholic bishop faced many challenges to do so, and he gave all credit to God for helping him overcome those challenges. They included escaping captivity, taking the place of a missionary bishop who was killed, being unjustly imprisoned and facing constant danger from the pagans who didn't want him there.
