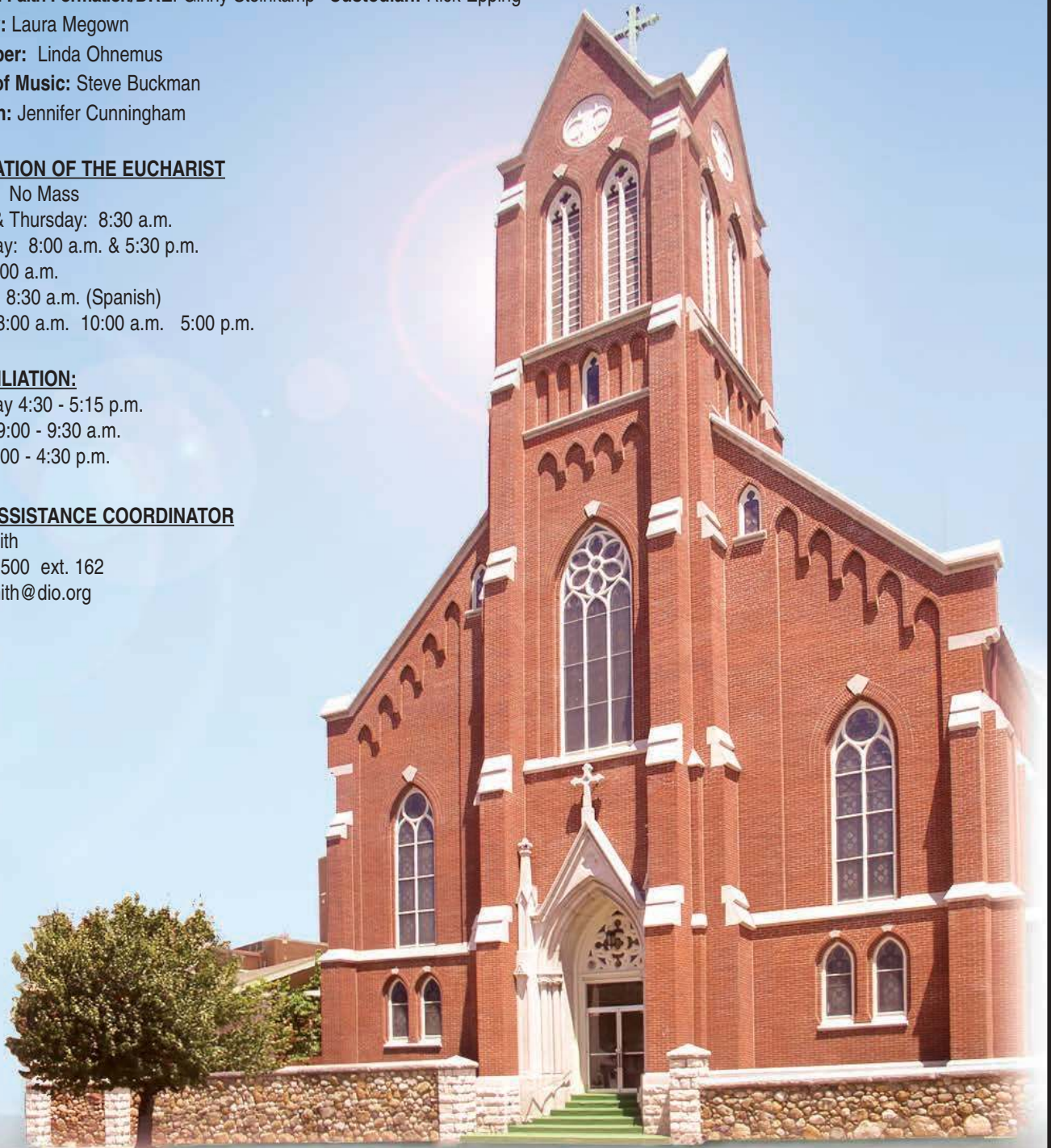

Today we celebrate the **4th Sunday of Lent**. In the gospel we hear Jesus address Nicodemus on the reason why the Messiah must suffer. "Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of man be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life." We too must be willing to share in our Lord's cross in order to share in the "lifting up" of his resurrection.

Today our RCIA elect celebrate their **Second Scrutiny**. The Church teaches that the Scrutinies are "rites for self-searching and repentance...The Scrutinies are meant to uncover, then heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts of the elect." We pray that our elect and candidates may join us throughout Lent to reflect on their own weaknesses and find healing in God's grace and mercy.

Quincy Notre Dame last week kicked off their Annual Fund. Please consider a generous donation to QND in support of their continuing mission of Catholic High School education for the young people and families of our Quincy area.

This season of Lent our parish is recommending a new video Bible series, "**Parousia: The Bible and the Mass**," produced by **Scott Hahn and the St. Paul Center for Biblical Theology**. It is a 10-episode video series, each video 30 minutes in length. This video series is being offered free by the St. Paul Center only during the upcoming season of Lent. At Blessed Sacrament we are offering the opportunity to watch these episodes in five weekly 1-hour video sessions here in church, where you can watch these episodes with fellow parish members.

3 Bold Saints



St. Benedict is a saint that we can call on to help the poor and the downtrodden. Called “the Beggar of Rome,” St. Benedict Joseph Labre was born in Amettes, France, on March 25, 1748, the eldest of eighteen children. Studying under his uncle, a parish priest, Benedict tried to join the Trappists, Carthusians and Cistercians to enter religious life but was unsuccessful due to his poor health and a lack of suitable academic preparation. In 1770, he made a pilgrimage to the major shrines of Europe, settling in Rome in 1774. There he lived near the Coliseum and earned fame for his sanctity. He traveled from great shrine to another, living off alms. He wore the rags of a beggar and shared his food with the poor. Filled with the love of God and neighbor, Benedict had a special devotion to the Blessed Mother and the Blessed Sacrament and attended the Forty Hours devotion in the city.

Most Catholics associate St. Anthony with finding lost items, lost causes and most importantly lost souls. It was believed that hearing St. Anthony’s voice alone had the power to convert believers after hearing just one sermon. How incredible is that? It is also said that he was such an effective orator that his sermons moved people in powerful ways. This also includes Catholics who strayed away from the Church. Turning to and calling on St. Anthony called them back to the religion. There was a time during his earthly ministry that a large group of people listening to him repented and turned to the Church in droves. This act alone earned him the nickname ‘The Hammer of Heretics.’

St. Rita is the saint of impossible causes. If you are struggling with infertility or miscarriage, getting pregnant seems like the impossible dream. Every month that goes by without a pregnancy or every miscarried baby adds to the desperation and feeling hopelessness. If you’re struggling with infertility, St. Rita is a saint you can turn to. Daughter of Antonio and Amata Lotti, a couple known as the Peacemakers of Jesus; they had Rita late in life. Rita lived 40 years in the convent, spending her time in prayer and charity and working for peace in the region. She was devoted to the Passion, and in response to a prayer to suffer as Christ, she received a chronic head wound that appeared to have been caused by a crown of thorns, which bled for 15 years. She is well known as the patron of desperate, seemingly impossible causes and situations because she has been involved in so many stages of life – wife, mother, widow and nun. She buried her family, helped bring peace to her city, saw her dreams denied and fulfilled – and never lost her faith in God.
