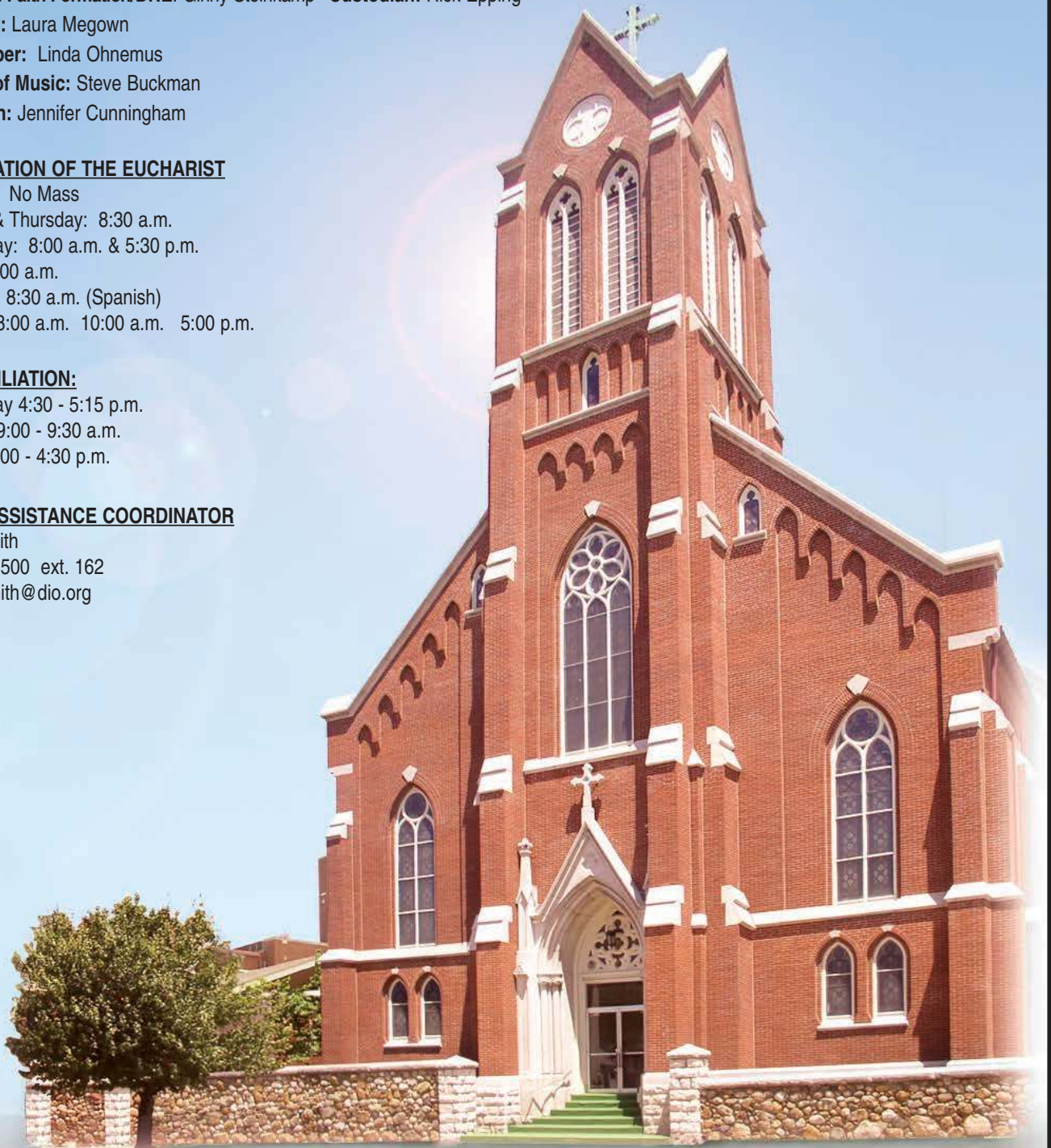

From the Pastor's Desk

Today we celebrate the **5th Sunday of Lent**. In the gospel a group of Greeks have come to the Passover. They approach the Apostle Philip, whose name is Greek, wanting to see Jesus. Philip goes to Andrew, whose name is also Greek, and together they approach Jesus with the request. Jesus' response is rather unusual, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified." Jesus then begins to speak of His approaching death. Jesus speaks to the Father, "Father, glorify your name." And the Father responds, "**I have glorified it and will glorify it again.**" By Jesus' death will the Father be glorified. It is only when the Son of Man is "lifted up" on the cross that Jesus will be able to draw everyone to Himself. Only then will the Greeks, and the entire world, be able to "see" Jesus.

Today our RCIA elect celebrate their **Third Scrutiny**. The Church teaches that the Scrutinies are "rites for self-searching and repentance...The Scrutinies are meant to uncover, then heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts of the elect." We pray that our elect and candidates may join us throughout Lent to reflect on their own weaknesses and find healing in God's grace and mercy.

This season of Lent our parish is recommending a new video Bible series, "**Parousia: The Bible and the Mass**," produced by Scott Hahn and the St. Paul Center for Biblical Theology. Our final episodes are this upcoming Friday evening:

Reconciliation

Confession is an act of honesty and courage— an act of entrusting ourselves, beyond sin, to the mercy of a loving and forgiving God.

-Pope St. John Paul II

Why go to the Sacrament of Reconciliation?

The Sacraments are moments where we encounter the life of Christ. Pope Leo the Great says, “Our Redeemer’s visible presence has passed into the sacraments.” In the Sacrament of Reconciliation, we encounter profound Divine Mercy. This forgiveness enables us to live peacefully and forgive others as well. It is important to note that when we are in a state of serious sin, we must first go to Reconciliation before receiving the Eucharist. 1 Corinthians 11:27 says, “For anyone who eats and drinks without discerning the body eats and drinks judgment on himself.” The Sacrament of Reconciliation clears away the grime of sin in our hearts so that they may be tabernacles for the Lord to dwell in.

It has been a while since I went to Reconciliation, what do I do?

First, as you enter the confessional and kneel, say “Bless me Father for I have sinned, my last confession was (insert how long approximately it has been 1 month, 1 year, 1 decade, etc.). Then you will list your sins in number and kind. We give the approximate number or how frequently this is a sin we struggle with. For example, one might say, “I take the Lord’s name in vain several times a week. The

priest might give some words of counsel or encouragement and then he will ask you to make an Act of Contrition which can sound something like the following, “My God, I am sorry for my sins with all my heart. In choosing to do wrong and failing to do good, I have sinned against you whom I should love above all things. I firmly intend, with your help, to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid whatever leads me to sin. Our Savior Jesus Christ suffered and died for us. In his name, my God, have mercy.” Then, the priest will give you a penance, usually a series of prayers and absolution. It is best that the penance is completed before you leave the church. That way you don’t accidentally forget. We want to not just tell God we are sorry, but show Him.

When does Blessed Sacrament offer the Sacrament of Reconciliation?

Lent is a great time to receive this Sacrament. It is a way to “Turn away from sin and believe in the Gospel.” The Blessed Sacrament Reconciliation Schedule is as follows:

Wednesday: 4:30-5:00 p.m.

Saturday: 9:00-9:30 a.m.

Sunday: 4:00-4:30 p.m.

Examination of Conscience

When was my last good Confession? Did I receive Communion or other sacraments while in the state of mortal sin? Did I intentionally fail to confess some mortal sin in my previous Confession?

Did I willfully and seriously doubt my faith, or put myself in danger of losing it by reading literature hostile to Catholic teachings or by getting involved with non-Catholic sects? Did I engage in superstitious activities: palm reading, fortune telling?

Did I take the name of God in vain? Did I curse or take a false oath? Did I use bad language?

Did I miss Mass on a Sunday or a Holy Day of Obligation through my own fault, without any serious reason? Did I fast and abstain on the prescribed days?

Did I disobey my parents or lawful superiors in important matters?

Was I selfish in how I treated others, especially my spouse, my brothers and sisters, my relatives, or my friends? Did I hatefully, quarrel with anyone, or desire revenge? Did I refuse to forgive? Did I cause physical injury or even death? Did I get drunk? Did I take illicit drugs? Did I consent to, advise, or actively take part in an abortion?

Did I willfully look at indecent pictures or watch immoral movies? Did I read immoral books or magazines? Did I engage in impure jokes or conversations? Did I willfully entertain impure thoughts or feelings? Did I commit impure acts, alone or with others? Did I take contraceptive or abortifacient pills, or use other artificial means in order to prevent conception?

Did I steal or damage another’s property? How much? Have I made reparation for the damages done? Have I been honest in my business relations?

Did I tell lies? Did I sin by slander? By detraction - telling unknown grave faults of others without necessity? Did I judge others rashly in serious matters? Have I tried to make restitution for any damage of reputation that I have caused?
