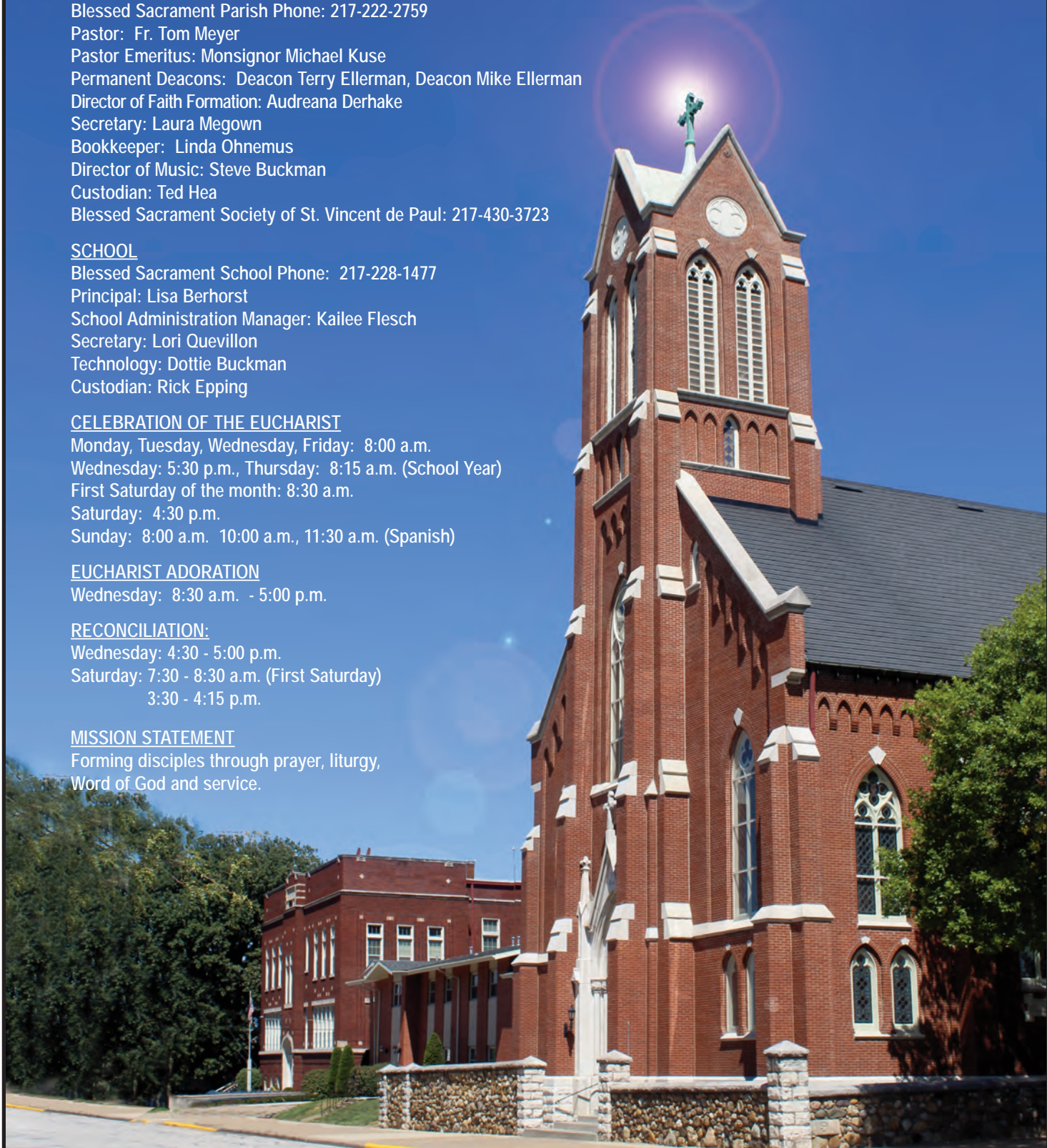

From the Pastor's Desk

Today we celebrate the **8th Sunday in Ordinary Time**. In the gospel today Jesus asks his disciples the question, "Why do you notice the splinter in your brother's eye, but do not perceive the wooden beam in your own?" Jesus is confronting the tendency within all of us to judge our neighbor. "You hypocrite! Remove the wooden beam from your eye first; then you will see clearly to remove the splinter in your brother's eye." This coming Lent is a wonderful opportunity for all of us to cooperate with the Lord in His removing the beams from our eyes that keep us from seeing.

This weekend (March 1-2) **Quincy Notre Dame kicks off their Annual Fund with a talk at all Masses by current QND students**. As a QND alumnus, I can personally attest to the value of a QND education. I ask that parish members listen with your hearts this week to the testimony provided by our QND students. We hope that we all might respond generously to the QND Annual Fund Drive.

This upcoming **Tuesday, March 4** please join us for **Theology on Tap at 6:00 p.m.** at the Fuzzy Bubbler. **Fr. Pikus**- pastor of St. Rose here in Quincy - will be our speaker this upcoming Tue. evening of Mardi Gras. Please come join us!

This upcoming Wednesday marks the beginning of the season of Lent as we celebrate **Ash Wednesday**. Our Ash Wednesday liturgies will be celebrated at the following three times:

**8:15 a.m. Mass
4:00 p.m. Spanish Mass
5:30 p.m. Mass**

The season of **Lent** should include the following elements for us to focus upon: (1) Fasting -giving up something we like; (2) Prayer; and (3) Charity - doing charitable works for others and donating money to charity. Blessed Sacrament will provide several liturgical and devotional opportunities each week during Lent to assist you in your spiritual growth during this Lenten season.

The following are the **Lenten regulations** for Catholics to observe.

(1) Abstinence - Everyone 14 years of age and over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Friday's of Lent.

(2) Fast - Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 is required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Only one full meatless meal, and two much smaller meatless meals, are permitted. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are allowed.

(3) To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.

Please join us for our **Men's Group Lenten Soup Supper** next **Saturday, March 8 at 5:30 p.m.** (after the 4:30 p.m. Mass.)

Next Sunday, March 9 at 2:30 p.m. our RCIA catechumens travel to Springfield for the **Rite of Election**. At this celebration Bishop Thomas Paprocki officially welcomes all catechumens into the order of the "Elect". Next weekend we will celebrate a Rite of Sending before their departure. We pray for our RCIA catechumens and candidates as they begin their final preparations for the Easter sacraments.

At the recommendation of Bishop Paprocki, next weekend (March 8-9) we will be inviting parish members who participate in **Electronic giving to have the opportunity to place an Offertory Card, "I Give Electronically,"** into the Sunday Collection Basket on a weekly basis. This does not introduce any new cost. The purpose is for every parish member to have the opportunity to place something in the basket at each celebration of Sunday Mass. I hope to speak more about this briefly at Mass in the next few weeks.

Please mark your calendars for our **Parish Dinner scheduled for Saturday, March 15** at Quincy University. At this event we will be honoring **Msgr. Mike Kuse's 30th Anniversary of his arrival to Quincy to serve our parish**. This event is being organized by the Pastoral Council. More details are soon to follow.

An upcoming Lenten study series I would like to recommend is **"No Greater Love: A Biblical Walk through Christ's Passion,"** by **Dr. Edward Sri** of Ascension Press. Our study will include watching a weekly 30-minute video by Dr. Edward Sri set in the historical locations within the Holy Land itself. We will meet on the following Friday's of Lent in the Gathering Space. We encourage you to purchase the book, "No Greater Love," on your own (\$14.99 plus tax and shipping) to accompany this study. We hope you might join us.
