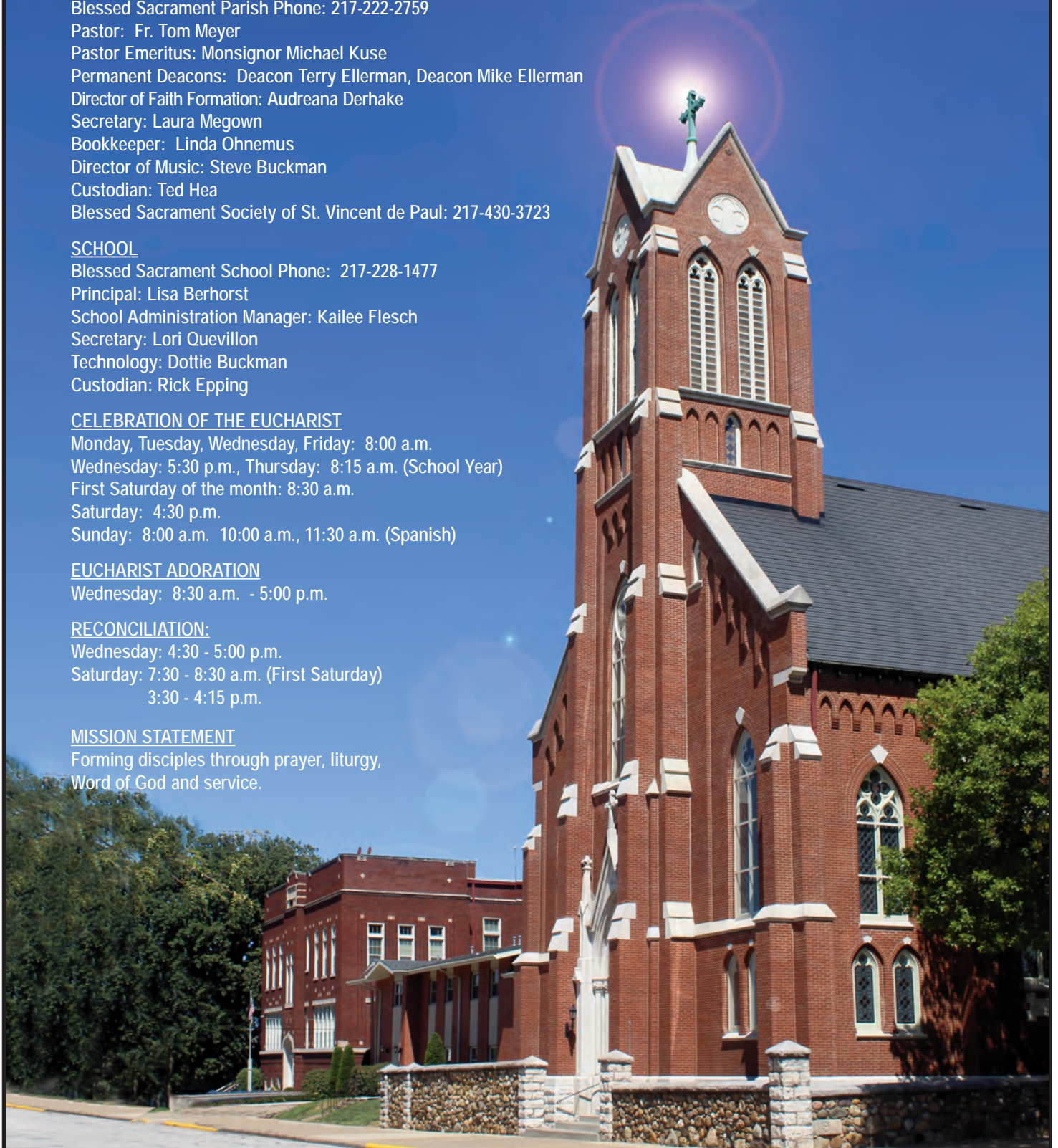

**From the Pastor's Desk**

Today we celebrate the **1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of Lent**. In the gospel we hear of Jesus' forty days in the desert being tempted by Satan. Our own forty days of Lent can also be an opportunity for us to be led into the desert where we can focus more deliberately on our relationship with God. May these forty days be for us an opportunity for spiritual renewal.

The season of **Lent** should include the following elements for us to focus upon: (1) Fasting -giving up something we like; (2) Prayer; and (3) Charity - doing charitable works for others and donating money to charity. Blessed Sacrament will provide several liturgical and devotional opportunities each week during Lent to assist you in your spiritual growth during this Lenten season.

Today (Sunday, March 9) at 2:30 p.m. our RCIA catechumens travel to Springfield for the **Rite of Election**. At this celebration Bishop Thomas Paprocki officially welcomes all catechumens into the order of the "Elect". This weekend we will celebrate a Rite of Sending before their departure. We pray for our RCIA catechumens and candidates as they begin their final preparations for the Easter sacraments.

At the recommendation of Bishop Paprocki, this weekend (March 8-9) we will be inviting parish members who participate in **Electronic giving to have the opportunity to place an Offertory Card, "I Give Electronically,"** into the Sunday Collection Basket on a weekly basis. The purpose is for every parish member to have the opportunity to place something in the basket at each celebration of Sunday Mass. I hope to speak more about this briefly at Mass in the next few weeks.

A Lenten study series I would like to recommend is **"No Greater Love: A Biblical Walk through Christ's Passion,"** by Dr. Edward Sri of Ascension Press. ## CANDLEMAS HOUSE PANCAKE DAY

Candlemas is a religious holiday. It is celebrated on the 40th day after Christmas. Its etymological origin comes from the candles used that day instead of the usual torches. They are lit in the church and the faithful keep them home, put them on a window to bring light, purity and ward off evil.

The round shape of the pancake as well as its golden color are a representation of the sun and the return to light. It is also the coronation of spring. A tribute to the days that are getting longer and to the light, to the cycle of the seasons and the announcement of spring.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Soon our diocese will take up The Catholic Relief Services Collection. Your support for this collection provides emergency assistance to victims of war and natural disasters; assists migrants and refugees who need housing, education, and specialized legal assistance; and supports travelers and others whose livelihoods require special pastoral support to access the sacraments. Among the most vulnerable of migrants are the victims of human trafficking.

Millions of men, women, and children worldwide are coerced or forced through human trafficking into commercial sex activities, labor, and slavery – abuses which the Holy Father has called “a crime against humanity.” As part of its mission to proclaim Christ’s salvation and to restore and promote the dignity of all persons, the Church is called to combat trafficking and to bring comfort and healing to its victims.

The Department of Migration and Refugee Services (MRS) of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops carries out this mission through two anti-trafficking, anti-slavery programs. The Become a Shepherd program is a parish-based awareness campaign that educates lay and religious leaders to recognize human trafficking and combat it through public engagement and advocacy at the community level. The second initiative, COMPASS (Coalition of Organizations and Ministries Promoting the Abolition of Slavery at Sea), is a global effort in which international Catholic and non-Catholic partners coordinate to identify and assist victims of modern slavery encountered in the commercial fishing and seafood-processing industries.

The invaluable work to assist these victims of abuse and injustice is supported by funds received through The Catholic Relief Services Collection. Your participation helps MRS and five other Catholic ministries to reveal Christ’s love to victims of trafficking, war, and natural disaster both around the world and here in the United States.
